

## THE BAPTISM OF JESUS

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus is baptized in the Jordan by his cousin John the Baptist.

In our Catholic faith there are seven Sacraments. Sacraments are signs of Grace instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church by which Divine Life is given. The Sacred Scriptures contain the Word of God and are divinely inspired; therefore, we look to the Scriptures to see the origin of the Sacraments.

Jesus gave his church the Sacrament of Baptism when he told the Apostles "To go and make disciples of all nations and to baptize them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" MT 28: 18-20.

The Symbols of Baptism are. Water is the chosen symbol because it is so important in our lives. Our bodies are largely water. Water is the essence of our survival. We are refreshed by water and it brings life and growth.

Oil an ancient symbol is ever new. It heals, nourishes, energizes and beautifies. In the baptismal ceremony two different oils are used to signify that God will always be present to strengthen, heal and make beautiful. Oil of the Catechumens – Before Baptism Oil of Chrism – After Baptism – Person is anointed as Prophet, Priest and King as Jesus was.

The White Garment symbolizes that the baptized person has "put on Christ".

The Candle lit from the Easter Candle signifies that the baptized are the Light of Christ to the secular world.

This year to celebrate our Baptism, we will renew our Baptismal promises and after Mass there will be an opportunity to be anointed with Charism as Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet and King.

## **Mass Intentions**

We continue the tradition at St. Paul's of inviting people to have Masses said for a special intention. Most often this is for someone who has died but it may be for someone who is ill or is marking a special birthday or anniversary. If someone wants that Mass on a certain day that can be arranged if the day is not already taken, or the Mass is said and you are given a card to give the family. The church offering for Announced Masses, which is a Mass on a particular day is \$20.00 and an unannounced Mass is \$10.00. Having a Mass said is a great gift.

### **Baptism of the Lord**

Our faith embraces the tension of the hypostatic union – the fully divine *and* fully human nature of Jesus. The Baptism of the Lord is a profound instance of the revelation of the humanity of Jesus and his desire to draw close to us.

John the Baptist baptized people "for repentance" (Mathew 3.11). If Jesus is God, why would he need to be baptized for the forgiveness of sins? One possible answer is that Jesus was baptized in order to identify totally with us. He is the only member of the human race that does not need forgiveness; however, in order to identify with us, he humbled himself to undergo baptism. He even identified with the *effects* of sin that we experience: suffering and death. I draw great comfort and hope from this episode in Mathew's Gospel; Jesus is present in every experience of my life, even in my need for redemption and forgiveness. His act of humility has increased my intimacy with him.

Each time we gather for Mass, we bless ourselves with water from the baptismal font, calling to mind our baptism and Christ's. Let this week's Eucharist be an opportunity to give thanks that we have a Saviour who understands our humanity and the effect that sin has on it, even as God the Father Calls him "my Son, the Beloved."
