***** A Message from the Pastor

The Language of the Eucharist

I am not writing here about the use of English or Latin or any other language but want to give you a window for reflection to internalize the sacred act of worship that is the "source and summit" of our life. Those words come from the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council.

Here are some ways to enter into the Liturgy:

- 1. *Encounter:* In the Gospels we read in many places of Jesus' encounter with people. What is it like to be in His presence? Or, what is it like when Jesus walks into the room with me? One way to think about the Liturgy is to recognize that this encounter is happening together for us each time we celebrate the Mass or any of the sacraments.
- 2. *Holy Communion:* When Jesus says, "Do this in memory of me", we are given a sacred trust which literally embodies the bridge between our mortal lives and life with God. Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we keep faith with Jesus Himself. Our continuing worship is doing something to "build" that relationship. Certainly, we can and will become more deeply joined to that bond. Communion with God which we experience sacramentally begins already to give us the savour of that absolute communion for us in the life to come.
- 3. *A Holy Exchange:* It is not just that we are handling sacred things, but we are already becoming incorporated into Christ. That idea is all over St. Paul's writing. Sharing with each other is the building block of our relationships. Even for monastic communities started in the early centuries of the Church, hospitality, was a cornerstone. And why is this so important? In short, it changes us. In real ways, we, ourselves, are sacred and so we render to God something sacred in our worship. We know this because we can observe the effects of grace in our lives, and sense the fruitfulness of the sacraments. Think of the whole "schooling" of the apostles and disciples. There was a constant back and forth. I sometimes wonder what the exchanges that are not recorded in the Scriptures consisted of. The effect over time was the wonderful declaration: "I no longer call you servants but friends." They were being changed.
- 4. *A Contemplative Ritual:* I inserted that word, "contemplative" to try to suggest that sacred ritual transports us, takes us into the realm of the holy. In a constantly "innovating" world we are not so aware that when we do the same thing together with sacred intent we are naturally drawn beyond ourselves. It is why the exchange of consent for couples at weddings is the same, not for lack of imagination, but for the sharing that extends through time and space to all who embrace this sacred commitment.

I was aware of my own deepening understanding of the Liturgy, and more aware of it when I studied and learned more of its history and beauty. Our worship absolutely is something that we continue to grow into just as Jesus draws us more closely to Himself.
