A Message from the Pastor

Vocation to Religious Life

I wrote last week about vocations to the priesthood. Here in St. Paul's especially we also should have vocations to religious life front and centre of our minds. First off, I would say it seems to be a bit confusing for people. I don't know how many times I've been asked: "What community of priests do you belong to?" When I tell them I don't belong to a religious community they are often surprised, not realizing that diocesan priests are ordained but have not taken the vows of a religious community. We belong to our local bishop and diocese.

Religious life is marked by two important qualities. Each community has a specific spirituality or spiritual tradition and a specific kind of apostolate, literally a way of giving witness to the Good News. Depending on what communities you may have met in your lifetime you could have a wide variety of visions of what religious life entails.

Almost all religious communities embrace the "evangelical counsels" of poverty, chastity and obedience. Contemplative communities based in monasteries may also take a vow of stability – staying in the same place. The purpose of these vows is to give witness not just to the future hope of God's kingdom, but to make it easier to manifest



a communion with Christ and His reign in the present. Think of the pressures to earn money to flaunt one's success that are almost omnipresent in our world. Religious life helps us all to become more detached from these concerns and become focused on what is actually important, living our lives in love of God and neighbour. Are the sacrifices involved difficult? Yes, but in other ways they are liberating as well.

Locally, we are familiar with religious communities like the 'Sisters of St. Joseph', the 'Congregation of Notre Dame', the 'Sisters of Life', and the 'Capuchin Friars'. These are all communities that have a spiritual heart of prayer and whose work is actively present to the world.

In many parts of the world religious women and men are leaders in the daily lives of Catholics. The largest identifiable group of people associated with the Catholic Church worldwide are called catechists who, prepare people for sacraments, tend to pastoral needs, orchestrate ongoing formation and common prayer and who cultivate other leaders within the wider community. This is true also in some of Canada's remotest places and represents an important part of healing our relationship with indigenous peoples.


The simple reality of the Church is that in most of the Church's history the labourers have been few relative to the tasks they are called to respond to. I have no doubt the Holy Spirit continues to call forth people to religious life. Pray to the One whose harvest it is to provide happy and generous labourers who work in a variety of ways but who sing the same song of God's praise.
