A Message from the Pastor

Vocation of Married Life

As a little follow-up to last week, I thought a few words about marriage might be good.

One of the privileges I have as a parish priest is to work with couples preparing for marriage. I have worked with something like seven hundred (700) of them over the years. I learned early on that this time ahead of the wedding itself is especially important. During the year or so before the wedding, a couple is usually beginning to make real their vision of life together. As a priest, being involved with them is a wonderful opportunity to accompany them and hear them share the way that God is present in this vocation of mutual selfgiving. And from it there is a natural generosity, open to changed lives . . . and new ones! Our reading from Revelations refers to it today.

I began to realize that this accompaniment was worthwhile and started to have four interviews with each couple, a process that I have honed over the years. Still, today our first meeting is one where we look at this exalted time just before marriage, take time to get to know each other a little and begin to aim ourselves toward the goal of cementing God's grace of love and communion.



The second interview we take a serious look at the content and commitments of marriage. It is a time of mainly one-onone discussions. At the end of that interview, we discuss the opportunities that the marriage preparation course provides as a tool to see all that is good and even some of what may be "bad" or "ugly." Marriage is about marrying the whole person and not just their personality. The tools we put in our kit bag on the way, perform a critical role in growing more and more deeply into that life of love and communion. Our "tender spots" need compassion and encouragement. Most couples I have met are significantly together because this quality is present in both partners. The course lets them see that mirrored in one brief period of time, giving them the sense of what they bring to marriage as well as some possible tasks that lay ahead.

The third interview follows the completion of the prep course and is a fantastic opportunity for feedback and

sharing. I enjoy their sharing and the recognition of the strengths they have as well as the areas that will benefit from attention over time.

The last interview focuses on the liturgy itself. They share their experience of the Word of God in choosing the scripture texts for the day and we talk about the way that all this love is going to be embodied in the celebration of the sacrament. We close off the period of preparation and then launch into "proclamation," the love of God that they have received through family and friends and all that good grace in the life of the Spirit. The couple are the ministers of the Sacrament after all. They proclaim God's acts of grace in a special way and even more by the living out of their vocation.
