A Message from the Pastor

The Eucharist and the Praise of the Church



At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, we have "words of praise", stealing from Greek we call this "the Doxology" which ends with the Great

Amen. The Eucharist is at the centre of all the sacraments and the Prayer of the Church. Collectively, we call this the Liturgy. They are all joined together. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy from the Second Vatican Council calls the Eucharist "the source" and "the summit" of the life of the Church.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is no mistake that it follows right after Trinity Sunday and that both are on the heels of Pentecost. Jesus' dying and rising for our sake is the Trinitarian love of God being poured out on us in such a personal way. It also links us right away to the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, "take and eat, this is my body," and "take and drink this is the cup of my blood".

Traditionally, we have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and sometimes a procession with the Host in the monstrance. Hopefully, next year we will have enough people involved in ministry to do that. We will start to have Eucharistic Adoration sooner. Along with adoration one of our features as a basilica is to join our prayers to those of the Holy Father, especially through the praying of the Liturgy of the Hours, the Prayer of the Church. You may know about Morning Prayer or Evening Prayer (sometimes called Vespers). It can be very beautiful when combined with Eucharistic Adoration especially. The Liturgy of the Hours reminds us that every part of the day is sacred. It is part of a response to the reality that we are called to pray constantly. We can also see it as part of our being "sent out" to

proclaim the Good News, some of the fruit of the Eucharist.

For Jesus, the Eucharist is absolutely dynamic. It is the way by which we are made new in the image of God the Father. He does spend long hours in prayer with the Father; we hear it reported in the Gospels. But after those periods of prayer, He gets up and does the Father's will in the midst of us and all the messiness of Israel being dominated by the Roman Empire. While He teaches and acts with authority He is not seen as somehow "other". What He is sharing does draw us out of ourselves into a new realm of life. So, if we look at Jesus only from a human perspective, we will always have problems. When we express our desire to be joined to the invisible reality of the divine life He brings, we jump into a great adventure - one which brings us back always to the Eucharist. You have redeemed, us O Lord, in Your own Blood!
