A Message from the Pastor

The Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul

The Church will celebrate the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29th. We are celebrating First Holy Communion at our parish this weekend. On Monday evening at 7pm we will welcome a youth choir and bell ringers from Davidson United Methodist Church in Davidson, North Carolina. The choir is singing at several other locations in the GTA including St. James Anglican Cathedral. Please feel very welcome to gather at the basilica on Monday evening for 7pm for a beautiful experience together! St. Paul, the apostle, mostly associated with the spread of the Good News, helps us to rejoice in the faith and share the joy we have in serving God with our guests.

On the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, especially as a Basilica with St. Paul's name, we celebrate this feast of the Church's unity under the two apostles with vigour. Please pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. The ministry of St. Peter to serve as the centre of unity of the Church is not easy these days. We should understand that the Church's unity is the product of our active support. While there are many challenges, it will be by working together that we respond meaningfully and make the Gospel more transparent. As St. Peter and St. Paul were united in their witness to Christ capped by their



respective martyrdoms in Rome, so this feast draws us together as one ecclesial family.

This week will see our grade 8 students leaving elementary school and enjoying the heat of the summer before they launch into the next stage of their education in high school. The heart of Catholic education is the formation of the person to be able to receive God's love with gratitude and to return it with generosity. In this regard, everyone has important gifts. As good as outward success at school may be, it is the inner success of the soul that is so much more important. I ask you all to join me in prayer that our graduates may develop

quiet confidence to become true agents of Jesus. May God help them to have courage and perseverance and the lightness of heart to enjoy life's gifts as they mature and learn.

Lastly, a short word on my brief trip. I am headed this week to Rome for a conference of the International Association of Catholic Bioethicists. This is a group composed of people representing a variety of specialities (my only specialty is pastoral) who meet every two years to work together to share their knowledge and experience of different areas of health and medicine as they touch a faithful vision of Christian life. This year's topic is a broad one. We will be attempting to look at health in its widest perspective as a reality that exists within the whole ecology of the world that supports life. This integral view of life was already being spoken of by St. John Paul II and has been further developed in the years after his pontificate. Such "foundational" kind of work may not seem to be of immediate benefit, but it can serve to support the things that have more direct effect later on as the Church tries to articulate suitable support and guidance. I hope to share with you something of the fruits of the gathering at the parish some evening.
