#### Halfway Through the Summer – Looking Toward the Fall

I love to look back on the summers of my childhood. Those two months off were a great expanse of time! On the hot days I spent time under the big maple tree in the backyard. As the end of July came and the Civic Holiday Weekend loomed the shortening of days was beginning to be noticeable. The "Back to School" sales were in full swing (they are already these days). And then ... the CNE, the Canadian National Exhibition, was starting and that was the first definite sign that only a limited amount of time was left before going back to school. I contrast that with the times once I became a pastor. In planning for the parish's development, a year is a very short time. It all passes quickly.

There will be invitations mailed out shortly for our Mass with Cardinal Collins at 11am on September 18th. As well as being a very significant milestone it will be a chance for us as a parish to truly be together. I hope you will join in.

As well as the usual parish things getting started in the fall like sacramental prep, I am looking forward to hiring a youth minister. I am drawing up the job specification now and laying out a roadmap for the first couple of years. There are three important features to this addition to our parish team that I



would like to underline. First: the youth minister will strengthen our connection with students and families at St. Paul's school. We can look forward at the parish to seeing altar servers again and the families at the school will come to know that they are supported in their desires to thrive. Second: youth programs that are of specific interest to families in the parish will be developed. There is a lack of programming for young people in the downtown area. This will help our parish to be one where the spiritual needs of a greater number of people can be met. Third: young adults will be given the resources to develop more intentionally in their vocations, both according to their individual needs and in experiencing greater bonds of community.

As more pastoral activities happen in the parish, we will have the building blocks

to develop a meaningful parish pastoral council, one that can help us discern and facilitate a richer parish life.

A newsy note at the end here . . . I can report that we can expect to see work finally starting in a few weeks in our basement. After addressing the water intake from the city and doing some work now to address the drains as well, we will finally see our meeting spaces fixed back up.

Enjoy the remainder of the summer and come back ready to share in the next chapters of our parish life!
