❖ A Message from the Pastor

Setting the Stage for Our Celebration

Next week we will mark with a special Mass our 200th anniversary as a parish. Our Archbishop Cardinal Collins is coming to preside just as our first Bishop, Michael Power, came to the first St. Paul's to celebrate his first Mass in his newly created diocese of Toronto. The 18th of September has special significance for the then young Church of Toronto. 175 years ago, Bishop Power held a meeting in 1847 with civic officials and other leaders to work together on how to address the flood of refugees who had arrived, fleeing a terrible famine in Ireland. Over a million people died as a result of what is often simply called, the Famine.

It is good for us to remember especially the same absolute desperation that is front and centre in the lives of millions of people in today's world.

Our parish became a crossroads of the sorrows and of the efforts to relieve the sufferings of many. Only two weeks after this meeting, Bishop Power died of typhus fever himself. His funeral, also, was celebrated at the first St. Paul's. In the

succeeding decades our parish continued to see the new waves of immigration from afar and other parts of Canada. The true beauty of our church is not the art, as beautiful and lovingly made and preserved as that is, but the holiness of the people who have helped each other through these 200 years. As St. Paul so clearly announces, in Christ we are "neither slave nor free", but we are joined together to receive and share in the Good News of salvation itself.

The very fact that we have seen the need to help one another and that this has been a consistent feature of our parish life, helps us now, to know ourselves and understand the way we are called to live out our mission today.

In those early days it was not always possible to make life easy. What did happen however, was an accompaniement in faith and trust in the healing power of Christ. We too are called now to be faithful, knowing that when we accompany one another it will not always be easy and the outcomes that we see may not always be the ones we want to see. The true fruits, if we can live by faith, will be shown to us in the fullness of time. That commitment to Christ and to the salvation of one another, however, will bear great fruit, some of which we will see. We will see something of the greater vitality we are capable of and of the joy others have in becoming at home in their faith right here.

Next week we celebrate all the good of 200 vears and we also drink in the nourishment we need to continue to share in a vital parish community. May our welcome of our shepherd also nourish him and encourage in his continued witness to the Gospel and may we draw from him the deep communion that makes the Church part of the foretaste of Heaven.






Lecture Series – Listening to Indigenous Voices


at 7 pm, September 15, October 13, November 10 and December 8, at St. Peter's Church. To learn more visit stpeterstoronto.ca or scan the QR code.
