

A Message from the Pastor

A Chorus of Praise!

It was wonderful last Sunday to see so many people showing their love of God and their love of our parish community. In my 11 months here, it was my first opportunity to take in the joy of seeing people working together in such a dramatic way. Before the anniversary celebration I had fussed over the tone of the event. Were we going to make it a large public event with public officials? We explored that a bit and it certainly would normally have been the right thing to do. As time went on, however, I became more convinced that it was important for this event to be for us. We are coming out of the pandemic and connecting and reconnecting with one another and just beginning to envision our life together in the months and years ahead. And, I had not yet got to know very many of you either. For me, this has been a great opportunity to get to meet more of you and receive a little of the spirit of the parish.

As you may know, Cardinal Collins is now at an age where his retirement may be accepted by the Holy Father. From



his first days as the Archbishop of our Archdiocese, he has had a deep devotion to the example of our first Bishop, Michael Power. This was a chance to journey with him and with our own story more deeply and to appreciate how those early times could shed light on the charisms we need now. For me, at least, it was moving to have our present Archbishop connect with our parish, the first home of our first Bishop at a time when he may well be reflecting on his own ministry among us.

For us, I believe that last Sunday will prove to have been a very fruitful day for the development of pastoral life here. By working together, you have shown me the dynamics that will help me to discern not only what our next steps will be but something of the trajectory of our life together in the coming years.

The first step will be the renewal of some of our ministries and the development of a few new ones. On the immediate horizon will be workshops with lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, and ushers. We will also be restarting our altar servers.

My thanks go first to the Holy Spirit for bringing us together in such a beautiful way and for your generous responses. Those of you who stepped up and pitched in and those of you who did what I sometimes call "ministry of the pew" - all of you contributed in important ways! Did you hear the level of engaged and prayerful participation? It was very noticeable. In heaven we are to be a chorus like that ... except, of course, even more so. The Mass was indeed food for us now and for the fulfillment of our hope.



Mass Intention Scheduling


Mass Intentions are accepted for all parish Masses, contingent on availability.
