#### **❖ A Message from the Pastor**

#### **Music and Spirituality**

Quite possibly if you are coming to celebrate Mass at St. Paul's you are at least partly drawn by the music. Its influence on us is significant but we may not realize just how significant.

We conclude that this or that piece is beautiful or lifts us up. Well, there are good reasons for that.

- 1. 1. Music is the modern medium for poetry. Both the music and the words can open up our imaginations and transport us from our daily concerns. That's one good reason why music has pride of place in our worship.
- 2. Music is breath. Whether it is Gregorian chant or folk melodies with a sacred text in a hymn, the rise and fall, the movement and pauses all speak to us of the most elemental part of life - breathing and breathing out. It takes us to our centre from where life can be renewed.
- 3. The beat goes on. Music generally has a rhythm. When it is slower it echoes our lives at rest and peace. Think of a waltz played by

- melodious strings. It can be regular or irregular and may take us on a journey through the ups and downs of life.
- 4. Music is the human voice. Even when we are listening to instrumental music they often imitate the human voice. Wind instruments and brass require breath and give breath voice shaped by the talents of the musician. String instruments vibrate, slide, bounce and have tones and overtones like the human voice. I love Ella Fitzgerald, for example, whose voice to my ears was rich with tones and overtones. Even percussion instruments have a kind of voice in their resonance, as you listen to the decay of a drum or of cymbals.

In all these ways music provides tools by which we express and reveal our deepest selves. When music is at the service of our spiritual life it serves to reveal not only the goodness of the artist but becomes a means by which we have revealed to us something of our own hearts. Certainly, some music can be oppressive and we can use music to reinforce negative feelings sometimes but music holds such



possibilities of opening us that it can be a great ally and expression of the spiritual life. Chant, for example, developed just in that way ... to help those praying to offer themselves more deeply and together as a worshipping body.

I will close this little reflection with the reminder that we have a concert coming up on October 21st with our organ, a breathy instrument that uses air to make music just like our vocal cords. And like a big version of our body, the church will resonate with those sounds and help us to travel to new spiritually enriching places.


#### Film Screening: Waban-Aki: People from where the Sun Rises
