
Praying for Our Loved Ones

November is traditionally set aside in the Church for praying for our deceased loved ones. The Solemnity of All Saints is followed by the Memorial of All Souls. I'd like to visit this important part of our life by recalling a little of my own past.

When I was quite young (maybe five or six) I started attending family funerals. My dad's family is numerous and because he married in his late 40's there were many older relatives in those days. I learned very quickly that funerals especially of these older relatives were approached with equal measures of grief and gratitude. At the wake, there would be many stories shared and loving togetherness. Even I felt it in this dignified and solemn act of journeying with the person who had died.

Why was that? It is safe to say that the body of my relatives believed in the resurrection and knew that the person who had died believed the same. Our prayers together and especially at the funeral Mass were natural outpourings of that faith. The journey to the cemetery was a way of keeping faith also with the deceased person. I am still one of those people who goes to

the cemetery to visit my parents, relatives, and friends. I also like to make at least an annual pilgrimage to the clergy cemetery located at St. Augustine's Seminary. Many of the priests I knew as a child, growing up and into my early priestly years are buried there. I pray for them, talk to them, and stand quietly next to them.



As the practice of the faith has declined our families are not necessarily populated with people who share these basic Christian beliefs. Perhaps that's a stronger reason to get to know each other and to pray for one another – to provide spiritual support for our salvation. It might also be a good idea to write down our desires with respect to the funeral. Just as our Baptism comes at the beginning of our life with Christ on this earth, the funeral liturgy accompanies our journey into the care of God the Father.

About a year ago I drove out to Dundas Ontario and visited the parish cemetery there. It is an old Ontario parish like ours. Among the relatives I found there were a couple of O'Connor sisters whose names I had heard spoken many times by my aunts and uncles. I also found the parents of a friend of mine when I was a young adult. Connecting with people I had never met I experience as a great consolation of our faith. It makes me aware that I am part of something indeed much greater than the world I see immediately around me.

Praying for those who have died has what the Church sometimes calls, "merit". We hear that word in our prayers at Mass sometimes. The "merit" is our own cooperation with God's grace that is effective. We are part of making the divine will happen, in this case helping our loved ones to come to see God face-to-face.

I invite you to feel free to enter names into our Book of Remembrance as we pray together during the month of November. The book will be blessed and initiated on All Souls' Day and will remain in the church until we begin the celebration of Advent.

Film Screening: Waban-Aki: People from where the Sun Rises


