❖ A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The Liturgical Year

We are approaching the end of another liturgical year. The Solemnity of Christ the King holds up to us Christ's victory over sin and death and the ultimate reign of Christ over a creation made new. As we have heard over the last several weeks, the Word of God has proclaimed this through the writings of St. Paul and in St. Luke's Gospel.

And, when the following Sunday arrives, we will start a new year with the First Sunday in Advent. This takes us back to anticipating the intervention of God in human history through the Word becoming flesh – the birth of Jesus. It also carries with it the echo of that view toward the fulfilment of the Kingdom that we have been hearing over these last several weeks – Christ's second coming. We can feel ourselves walking shoulder to shoulder with those early believers who keenly felt that God's saving work would be completed soon. And we can visit again the first joy of faith when we

ourselves realized that God did come to dwell with us and show us the way to life.

The whole arc of the liturgical year is meant to take us on a journey with Christ. It is a continuing meditation on the heart of our life. The earliest believers pined for it. Unlike our modern time-conscious days, believers wanted to hear MORE!

The calendar is designed to help us hear more. Each year is devoted to one of the first three Gospels: Matthew, Mark and Luke. So, we will start to proclaim Matthew's Gospel when Ordinary Time starts after the Christmas season. The first reading each week is meant to go with the Gospel. The second reading works its way through the letters and in the Easter season, walks us through the Acts of the Apostles. Sometimes, the second reading echoes something of the Gospel and sometimes it is on its own. We hear John's Gospel through the Easter season every year.

The way to prepare for Sunday, then, is to read the Gospel and meditate on it, and

then to read the first reading, followed by a reading of all the readings as they are proclaimed on Sunday, including the psalm text that complements the first reading. The deeper voice of the Scriptures will then sneak up on us and when they are proclaimed on Sunday, we will hear them with fresh ears and heart.

There are several apps that allow you to follow the readings as they are proclaimed at Mass. Living with Christ has an app that will give you the translation we use in Canada. I use iBreviary which contains the Liturgy of the Hours as well as daily Mass readings. Universalis is also another good one. Word Among Us also has an app. You can obtain a hard copy of the readings by subscribing through Novalis to Living with Christ or the Sunday readings by purchasing a Sunday paperback Missal. We also have Living with Christ for sale at the front of the church for your convenience.

Free Webinar: Estate Planning from a Catholic Perspective


