

❖ A Message from the Pastor

The Twelve Days of Christmas

We know that old Christmas song and love to rhyme off the different gifts for each day of Christmas, especially, "FIVE GOLDEN RINGS!" The giving and receiving of gifts and the socializing that are part of this season are enjoyable blessings of the season. The subtext for some may be loneliness or the interior upset of difficult memories. This is a charged period of time. At the very least, many of us are exhausted by the time Christmas itself arrives.

The season has been skewed by the way marketing has exploited this time; it can leave us feeling inadequate and Traditionally, the Twelve Days of Christmas extended the feast from Christmas Day itself to Epiphany. In Canada, rarely do we get twelve days because Epiphany is transferred to Sunday rather than being on January 6th. School holidays often end before Epiphany. Just the same, the idea of taking time after Christmas to see each other and recharge is both relevant and beautiful. In Lent we might think about the deeper disciplines that could help us to live the Christian life more fully. But in Christmas season our appreciation and gratitude are at the forefront. And that might also lead us

to reach out to some of our family and friends who may not be surrounded by family at Christmas time. And if we find ourselves keeping our own company we can also dip into our sense of gratitude. Who has helped us in our life? A short word of thanks can be a boost for all concerned. Part of what a parish is about also is the way in which we are extended family to one another. I hope that we grow some different ways to express that. Expect to see some developments in this regard in 2023.

In many European countries the traditional day for the exchange of gifts has been Epiphany, mirroring the gifts of the Magi before the Christ child. When we exchange our gifts, can we see we are giving them to someone we love who is another Christ for us? Perhaps it is truer than we realize. Thank you!

Santa Claus we also know as a kind of alias for "St. Nicolas". His gifts represent the blessings that children are for us. His generosity is a modern-day miracle that even those without faith accept.

In this moment when our gratitude is allowed to flower may we take time to be truly grateful for Jesus, for one another and for the privilege of sharing God's saving love in every moment.


