

#### **Family Rituals at Christmas**

We are built for ritual. As you placed yourself in the pew for this joyful celebration of the arrival of our Saviour, you brought the heart of your life with you. What we might say out loud is that we connect with the sights and sounds, the carols, the rituals at church and at home.

Modern life prods us to glide over it, to accept its comforting aspect without taking time to hear our own inner voice calling us to be fed at a deeper level. In the same way, the outer trappings of the Church can obscure its inner beauty where we are connected by a profound communion that we believe and know comes from God's initiative to live among us.

As you go to or welcome family and friends today and in the coming days, slow down long enough to savour the spontaneous gifts and your own particular traditions that capture what is meaningful and true. We are so full these days of thinking about our "own truth" we easily miss that the deeper truth is what draws us out of ourselves and into relationship and community. This is getting us closer to what it is to be joined together in the Church.

In our house, when I was growing up, we had a few rituals. On our way out the door before going to Mass on Christmas Eve we would place the baby Jesus in the crib. That was our sign that Christmas had arrived. My parents, wisely I thought, began a tradition where we received a gift from Jesus at supper time on Christmas Day. It was a simple gift usually and always a game that my sister and I could play. Jesus wanted my parents to have a peaceful Christmas supper that would give us something to do after dinner and occupy us as we were getting tired. Rituals don't always have to have an elevated purpose. This one was humane, loving, beautiful and conveyed the fact that our faith touched even the simplest parts of our lives.

As we centre ourselves on the truth that God did not leave us alone, but came to be in this world with us, may we treasure the ways that this becomes visible in our lives. Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus!


Please DO NOT use the 2023 envelopes until the new year begins.
