# **A Message from the Pastor**

## **God-With-Us: Our Faith Has Implications**

Today we celebrate a feast closely allied to Christmas itself, "Mary, the Mother of God". In much of Eastern Christianity the term used translates to "The God-Bearer", in Greek, "Theotokos". This changes our relationship with God. God is no longer "out there". God is "here".

Virtually all religious traditions express relationship with the divine by calling for a way of life with particular characteristics. In our world that values personal liberty, it runs against the grain. I will just say as a person in his early 60's now, I have known many people who have had to upend their lives in their 50's to re-establish stable life. Maybe there is something missing in that liberty. My guess is that with all the manipulations that are part and parcel of life we are not as free as we think and internally, we have many things to work out. In our faith life we call this the "purgative" stage of the spiritual life. We get rid of the things that get in the way.

A few points: One: Some discipline in our lives not only is good, but if it is of the right sort, it helps us to clarify and act effectively in what is most important. Direction and vision of any kind imply boundaries. We are going to do some things and not others. Two: Many of the implications of our faith are directed not only at our own good but that of others. We are being formed into a people who belong to God together. This can both be good and can involve sacrifice. Three: The right sacrifices in our life will help us to live more fruitfully. We can closet ourselves in with our self-expectations but developing the virtues that fit us will help us to see and live beyond ourselves in happy relationship with God and in mature love with others.

When we understand that living in conformity with Christ's expectations, is both challenging and fruitful, we may find a new springboard from which to live.

When Mary said, "Let it be done to me, according to Your Word", she didn't have all the implications in her mind, but her developed love of God allowed her to be free, and to say, "Yes!". As our minds turn to going back to work and to school and to thriving in the cold days of winter, help us, O Lord, to find that quiet place where we can say, "Yes" to the implications of Your coming to us! O Mary, Mother of God, draw near to us so that we may share the closeness with Your Son that you enjoy!
