A Variety for the Octave of Easter, the Sunday of Divine Mercy

Off the top ... I hope you have had a joy-filled week to celebrate the reality of our salvation in the Risen Lord. The whole week has been a continuation of the Easter Day.

Second ... I want to share with you a little event that happened quietly before Easter. As some will remember, when I first arrived I was asking questions about a bingo that the parish was hosting at Delta Bingo Hall. I discovered a very dedicated volunteer, Anna Giardino, who has shouldered much of the weight of the hours to raise money in support of our breakfast club. As you may also know, COVID was not kind to this staple of our parish life and by the time I arrived the pool of volunteers was not sufficient to remount it. The school, however, is now operating a nutrition program. Last week I was at the school with Anna to present a cheque on behalf of St. Paul's Parish to the school for over \$35,400. This will help the school to enhance what it is doing and to offer support for the families of students.

Third ... Thank you to everyone involved in our Holy Week and Easter liturgies! We had excellent altar serving from Michael, and great music from Joe and Allison and our visiting trumpeter. Our decorator, Ewa, outdid herself with good taste and reverence. Readers, Ministers of Communion, collection counters, ushers, Cathy our sacristan and Ives our custodian – Thank You! For the glory of God and assisting the prayer and worship of the whole community you all have contributed something beautiful to our reception of Our Risen Lord.

Fourth ... This weekend is the Octave of Easter, our 8th day of the Easter Day itself. The devotion to Divine Mercy and its closeness to the heart of Pope John Paul II has joined it to the Octave. Divine Mercy is the redeeming love of Jesus given through His sacrifice and resulting in the conquering of sin and death for us all. As a devotion it is simple in form because it goes to the centre. It is like the "Jesus Prayer" of the East: Christ Jesus, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner." The devotional prayer proclaims the power of that mercy. We pray for it of course and we are sent out to concretely share it as well. Particularly at this time of spiritual renewal in our hearts we can be more convinced that we have been given God's love and mercy so as to share it. Let's make Easter season this year a particularly fruitful one for those we serve.
