

❖ A Message from the Pastor



New Life in Christ: Are You Being Called to Become Baptized?

This weekend we are beginning our process, known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults ('RCIA'), wherein adults who have either not been baptized, were baptized in a different Christian faith or who wish to complete their Sacrament of Confirmation, commence their journey toward baptism and full reception into the Catholic Church.

The Church sees this journey as essentially one of prayer, that takes what we understand to be revealed by God, in Christ, and allows it to move deeply into every part of our lives. The first phase in this journey is devoted to one of introduction and inquiry ... 'asking how God has called us to a deeper union?' Beginning this weekend, this initial introduction and inquiry phase will take place over a series of ongoing weekly meetings between now and the autumn, with a break over the summer months.

The next step after inquiry is enrolment; a formal recognition and acceptance of the desire and willingness to be a part of this process. For those not yet baptized ('catechumens'), enrolment puts them on the path towards baptism. For those already baptized ('candidates'), it marks the beginning of their preparation to be fully welcomed into the Catholic Church and to receive the final Sacrament of Initiation, Confirmation.

Once enrolled, participants attend Mass, but are dismissed after the Liturgy of the Word, so they can reflect on the Word of the Lord and be gradually introduced to aspects of Catholic beliefs, practices and traditions.

Next year, the Lenten season will begin a bit earlier than usual, on February 14th, with Easter taking place on March 31st. Lent marks the immediate and most prayerful time of preparation, both for those undertaking this journey of faith and the Church

as a whole, as it journeys towards Easter. On the first Sunday of Lent, our regional bishop, Bishop Robert Kasun, will preside over a ceremony, known as the 'Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion' where catechumens and candidates, if they believe God is calling them, choose to become part of the Elect, by publicly acknowledging their desire to receive the Sacraments while the Church formally ratifies their readiness to do so. This ceremony is followed by the catechumens and candidates, along with the whole parish community, taking part in the three Scrutinies, one each at Masses on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays in Lent. It is a period of increased discernment and coming closer to God, purification of weak and sinful thoughts and enlightenment for a more profound spiritual preparation.

And finally ... at the Easter Vigil ... the rites are celebrated flowing from the announcement of Jesus' resurrection, followed by listening to God's Word about our whole story, from creation all the way up to the Church receiving and living the Good News. All three Sacraments of Initiation are celebrated: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. After Easter we have a short period of deepening our union with the mystery of God's love.

During these initial weeks of inquiry, anyone interested may join our group at any time as we walk together toward the new life of baptism. Our meetings will take place on Sundays at 9:45 am in the parish basement. If you have any questions, don't be afraid to come and speak to me after Mass or give the office a call.
