#### **A Message from the Pastor**

#### **Bringing the Good News to Our World**

About 25 years ago when I was a young pastor at Precious Blood Parish in Scarborough, I received a rather unusual associate pastor. Fr. Larry Saldanha had come to Toronto from Lahore, Pakistan, and like many newly arrived priests, was getting oriented to ministry in a very different context from the one he knew back home. He had a rich variety of experience, having been rector of the national seminary in Pakistan and the communications director for the Pakistani bishops. I enjoyed having him at the parish. I certainly learned from him and I hope he learned a few things from me. After a couple of years, we had a great surprise. The long arm of the Vatican had noticed Fr. Larry. The Holy Father wished to name him the Archbishop of Lahore. It was marvellous to see how Fr. Larry accepted going back home, leaving his siblings who were already established here in Canada and returning to lead the local church in a very challenging context. He chose as his motto: Heralds of Hope. With half a million Catholics in a sea of 29 million Muslims, how was

Archbishop Larry happily able to make this his motto?

When we read the Acts of the Apostles, we can follow how the apostles proclaimed Christ while also striving to live peaceably, first among themselves and, as much as possible, with the surrounding society which was not friendly to their new faith. Sometimes we look at this approach as some kind of compromise, but it is truly important that we live the Christian life. As St. Paul teaches, there are a variety of gifts. These result in varied vocations, including the Church's long track record of caring for everyone. When I received my letter of appointment as pastor it appointed me to the care of souls. That includes not

only my registered parishioners, but every soul in the territory of my parish. I am to be a father to them in the name of the bishop.

Archbishop Larry served his people in Lahore for almost a decade and managed to come home to Canada safely to be with his siblings again. There were some violent incidents, including the bombing of a school, through which he had to be the shepherd of his flock. He met these with the same dignity and secure faith that I had seen when he was working with our First Communion children and parents.

The Holy Spirit is by no means abandoning us in this increasingly secular world that is suspicious of religion. There is a way both to evangelize, and to care for this much divided world of ours. Like the apostles, and the early communities of Christian believers, it will be as much by how we live, as by our words, that Christ becomes known and welcomed. apostles and many other early believers paid the price of rejection. Happily living out our particular vocations, the price most of will have to pay, will be relatively small.

O Lord, help us to live in You by the breath of the Holy Spirit, Bearing fruit with lives of integrity.

Dwelling in Your Truth, may our living be a window, On the richness of Your Good News,

Helping our brothers and sisters to be released from all that binds them,

And to be freed to be joined to You.

We adore You O Christ, and we praise!

Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world!

#### Take a tour of St. Paul's Basilica




