Sheep Who Have a Shepherd! Living in Christ's Spirit Now!

We are hearing a part of St. Matthew's Gospel that comes after the collection of lessons teaching us the characteristics of true followers of Jesus. Just before today's passage Jesus performs many healings. These are the true fruits of the Kingdom. The experience of many people is that following the Law has not only become burdensome but the Law has been used to justify unjust relationships. The result is that the status quo is effectively violent toward many.

A kind of exhaustion has set in, "like sheep without a shepherd" (Mt. 9:36). There is a harvest to be had, however, that the New Covenant brings. In contrast to the exhausting efforts to live up to the socially expected standards of the Law, Jesus says:

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Mt. 11:28-30) That might be a little surprising to us. Isn't living the Christian life difficult? After all, Jesus says that the standard is higher. If we even harbour evil in our hearts without doing evil we are "in trouble".

As the apostles are called and sent out to manifest the fruits of the Kingdom with miracles, we see the Kingdom in Jesus' name making itself present. New life can come to us when we don't get in the way. Jesus is "meek and humble of heart". Our lives need also to be meek and humble of heart.

This is good to remember so we can have hope in our own deepening conversion and for the Church as a whole. Help us O Lord, to live and proclaim Your Kingdom like our Saviour Jesus. Help us to learn to be meek and humble of heart that Your Kingdom may come.
