A Message from the Paster

St. Michael the Archangel: The Messenger of Christ's Victory Over Sin

St. Michael is the patron saint of our Archdiocese and every year the feast is celebrated on September 29th. This year, our new archbishop, Francis Leo, will receive from the Pope's representative, the pallium, the sign of his shepherding ministry in the name of Christ. Each day leading up to the celebration, you are asked to pray the novena to St. Michael the Archangel, available this weekend at the entrances of the church. As announced, this ceremony will take place during a special Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral at 5:30 pm on the 29th. Our parish Mass that day will be at 12:15 pm. Please pray for our whole local church of Toronto and for the fruits of the life and ministry of our new archbishop.

The day following the feast is a national day devoted to healing and reconciliation with our indigenous peoples in Canada. As I said in the homily last week, reconciliation is a positive action. Healing and forgiveness have to engage us. For them we will have to be patient and mature.



We all have some experiences of being hurt and know that sometimes the way forward is not easy or clear enough for us to take any comfort. With the treatment of our indigenous peoples, we can multiply these difficulties through generations and geographic displacement. Though we may not have any personal connection to the injustices wrought on them, we do share a collective responsibility as members of the Catholic family and as members of Canadian society to listen and work with our First Nations. In these early stages, the most important thing may be to learn and to listen. Since the heart of our lives as Christians is healing and reconciliation this is an important way for us to live it. At the societal level there are also many steps to be taken. Historically, this has been messy, often with the federal and provincial governments failing to co-operate very effectively. have the luxury of not being an elected official, I might suggest that at a higher plane we may need to embody the life and importance of our First Nations in our constitution. In light of the very diverse cultures we now have in Canada, simply asserting that the country has two founding cultures, English and French seems to lack something important.

Next weekend, September 30th and October 1st, in place of the planned preservation fund collection, there will be a special collection to support the commitment that our Canadian bishops have made to First Nations peoples as part of our effort at reconciliation and healing. Please be supportive.
