Allowing Grace to be Fruitful

90 - 4

St. Paul writes often about how we live "in Christ". Evangelicals may ask you, "Have you been born again?" In Baptism we enter into Christ's death, again, St. Paul tells us that, and into His resurrection, beginning to experience His gifts as the first fruits of the Kingdom. And

therein lies the question for us ... how fruitful are the graces we have received in the sacraments going to be in our life? That's our project as followers of Jesus. We want no barriers to the effectiveness of God's grace in our lives.

The parish is beginning one avenue for that process of becoming more open to the fruits of Christ's gift of new life. Alpha is one venture. We will see a variety of these opportunities in the coming years.

Not only is the content of the program providing good food for the mind and soul, but the conversations we have will let us open new horizons for one another. An added bonus is the increased sense of



real community and spiritual togetherness that will be fostered.

Our faith is not a "one size fits all" proposition. Alpha may be a fit for some and for others, avenues for deepening life in Christ may be different. Variety is the spice of life and more will be coming.

On other fronts, we are now accepting registrations for the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist (First Holy Communion). We are expecting a short visit from Archbishop Francis Leo on December 2nd when he will celebrate the 4:30pm Mass here at the parish. On February 3rd next year we will host a concert of the Estonian Philharmonic

Chamber Choir ('epcc.ee/en'). This world-famous European choir specializes in pieces by modern composers of chant. You can find videos of them singing on YouTube. Their recordings are on a variety of major classical labels including, ECM and BIS. For streaming

you can find them on Spotify, Tidal, Qobuz and Apple Music (and perhaps others). Tickets for the concert at our parish are available through the

Soundstreams website at 'soundstreams.ca/events/ estonian-philharmonicchamber-choir-2/' or by scanning the QR code.



I also hope I will be able to share with you our upcoming maintenance projects and some updates on the practical aspects of the parish's operations.

You may have heard about the parish's plans to host an Alpha series beginning this Fall, but what exactly is Alpha...

What is Alpha? Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that freely explore the basics of the Christian faith.

Who's it for? Alpha is for anyone who's curious. The talks are designed to encourage conversation and explore the basics of the Christian faith in a friendly, open environment. No question is out of Alpha bounds and you are free to discuss as much or as little as you want.

How does it work? Alpha runs for 7-12 sessions. Each session includes food, a short talk and discussion where you can share your thoughts and ask questions. There's no pressure, no follow up and no charge. Donations towards food costs are appreciated.
