❖ A Message from the Pastor



Consecrated Life

During this past week we observed the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commemorating the time that Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. They dedicated Him to God as was traditional for the first-born male. As often happens, feasts are an occasion to come in contact with different branches of life within the Church.

Every year on February 2nd we celebrate the Word Day for Consecrated Life. What is consecrated life? Many of us might say, "Oh, you mean religious sisters." Well, it is not quite that specific. Religious communities include women and men. Think of groups whose names you may know: The Sisters of St. Joseph, the Congregation of Notre Dame, the Jesuits, the Franciscans and the Basilians.

While diocesan priests make promises of chastity and obedience, religious communities take vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Collectively, we call these vows a commitment to the evangelical counsels. Contemplative communities may also take a vow of "stability", meaning that they stay within that one community.

Each community embodies a particular spirituality, often established by the community's founder, and a particular work or apostolate ("witness"). You may be familiar with the active communities that founded so many of our schools, for example. There are also more recently established communities like the Sisters of Life whose mission is to be present to nurture life

when we are most vulnerable at its beginning stages. Something like 25% of our parishes are led by priests from religious communities. In a group like the Companions of the Cross, we are witnessing a community that is in its maturing phase, having been only recently recognized as a religious community of diocesan rite. After a period of time, the community may apply to have its statutes recognized by the pope and become a religious community of pontifical rite.


The Holy Spirit is alive in the Church and the gifts of the Holy Spirit are alive among us! One hope we have in the Church is that these gifts may flower to bring forth the richness and depth of faith that will bring many to life in Christ. When we find our own commitment growing, working and praying together, the fruits and the seeds of consecrated life are showing themselves.

Consecrated life has been responsible for the evangelizing and nurturing of our faith in most of our homelands. Let us take time to pray for the present members of religious communities and for the work of the Spirit in raising up new communities with the charisms, spirituality and apostolates that will most fruitfully lead us to the Kingdom.
