

The Rite of Election: Preparation for Baptism of Adults

This Sunday, during the 11am Mass, we will celebrate the first half of the Rite of Election, with the second half of the Rite, presided over by Bishop Kasun, taking place at St. Michael's Cathedral later that same afternoon. Currently we have four people ('catechumens') who are preparing to receive all three Sacraments of Initiation at this year's Easter Vigil; Baptism, Confirmation and their first reception of the Holy Eucharist. During the Rite of Election each of these four catechumens will publicly acknowledge their desire to receive the Sacraments while the Church formally ratifies their readiness to do so.

Since last spring the four have been meeting with me every week, though we did take a break in July and August but made sure to have some time together in the middle of the summer. The process of preparation, also know as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA for short, is broken down into multiple stages. The first stage we refer to as the "pre-catechumenate" or the period of "enquiry". As a group, we began by sharing the way that God has been calling to each of us and then we began to pray together and reflect on God's revelation: the creation, Christ's proclamation of the Kingdom, the group of believers from the beginning and even in the present. In fact, this experience of being and participating in the life of the Church is really the springboard to the next preparation stage, "enrollment". Once enrolled, participants attend Mass so they can reflect on the Word of the Lord and be gradually introduced to aspects of Catholic beliefs, practices and traditions, preparing for new life in Christ.

This weekend as the four catechumens become members of the Elect, they are joined to us. We are invited to pray for and with them. We are excited that they will soon be among us living in Christ.

I have to tell you that this experience of walking with these people is a great source of encouragement to me, reminding me of the vitality of the Holy Spirit. I should also point out that we have one person who has already been baptized and will be received into the Church at Easter as well as three more people who have recently begun their journeys. You can expect to see more baptisms of adults before the year is out.

The season of Lent is constructed to support the journey of the Elect. It is a period of increased discernment and coming closer to God, purification of weak and sinful thoughts and enlightenment for a more profound spiritual preparation. As we celebrate some of the preparatory rites during Lent you will hear the readings from Year A, rather than the readings provided for this year which is Year B.

Lastly, I want to share with you an observation as I have learned about the journey of these adults. Virtually all of them had done a substantial amount of reading and studying before knocking on our door. They are remarkably well-informed and ready to learn more. As a priest, it is very exciting to me, to have people who are keen to deepen their life of faith!

Please continue to pray for the work of the Holy Spirit among us to touch us all to encounter the Lord more deeply.
