❖ A Message from the Pastor

Paul Has A Hard Time!

Wouldn't it be great if everything went smoothly? It's a wonderful feeling when things flow correctly; our work seems fruitful, our relationships sustaining and we have the pleasure of feeling satisfaction. Today's first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, describes an important event in the life of our patron, St. Paul. Paul travelled to Jerusalem; expecting a warm welcome from the apostles for all his good work abroad. Instead, he faced a barrage of questions and accusations, to the point he needed Barnabas as an ambassador. Apparently, his "success" in the Greek-speaking cities of the Mediterranean hadn't gone over well with the Jewish people in the region. His reputation preceded him, but not in a good way. While today's first reading ends with St. Paul being spirited away from Jerusalem to safety, this reading also speaks of the acceptance and ultimate fruitfulness of St. Paul's work.

A chapter or so after today's reading, as Paul works with Barnabas at Antioch, we hear of the first time the followers of The Way are called Christians. On a side note, Fr. Tony Farah, our in residence hospital chaplain, belongs to the Maronite Rite,



which has its patriarchate in Antioch and is of Aramaic origins, the language Jesus spoke. This serves as a good reminder that not all Catholics in the world are the same. There are many aspects from other ancient Catholic rites that can enrich us.

One of the biggest challenges Paul faced was the pressure for new Christians to become Jewish and follow prescribed Mosaic Laws. This led to the first Church council, the Council of Jerusalem, also known as the Apostolic Council. After prayer, much discussion and sharing accounts of conversion and initiation, the Apostolic Decree maintained certain Jewish prohibitions, such as idolatry and meat sacrifices, but affirmed that new Christians were not obligated to become Jewish and follow Mosaic Law in order to be seen as full members of the Church.

In my opinion, when faced with contentious situations, St. Paul demonstrated both a strong devotion to the graces he received and a patience demeanor with those he had to persuade. We can only dream of a world where all problems are worked out this way. St. Paul's last word on this topic is that it is Christ who acts in us and that anything fruitful is the work of Christ. Our brow may sweat; we may become frustrated at times, but with serenity in our souls and an abandonment to Christ, His work will be done in the end.

May Christ, the vinedresser, prune us all that we may bear abundant fruit!




Full of Grace: A Concert Honouring Mothers
