### **\*** A Message from the Pastor

New Priests: Ordinations, Saturday, May 11, 2024



This weekend Archbishop Leo is ordaining five men as priests: Fr. Marko Busic, Fr. Daniel Donghoon Lee, Fr. Ryan Nigli, Fr. Symon Sorbian, and Fr. Jeremy Zou. I remember my journey to the priesthood well. I was ordained at 28 after 5 years in formation, which felt as though it took a long time to complete. In fact, at that point it took up close to 20% of my time on earth, a significant a percentage of my young life. Now, after what will soon be 35 years of ministry, the time seems very short.

That period of preparation is equally spiritual and intellectual, requiring the ability to both understand and minister in a way that accords with what we believe to be revealed by God as Catholics. A priest learns a lot while exercising his ministry. Every community I've been privilege to serve has been different and called out of me skills that were needed for that time and place.

Who is the priest? There are many correct and complementary answers to this question. He "confects" the

Eucharist with the People of God. It is Christ who makes Himself present and the priest has the very great privilege of acting and speaking in His Person. A bishop ordains. He can ordain deacons, priests and even new bishops. A bishop makes present and is a successor of the apostles whom Jesus chose to form and nurture the Church. Priests share in the work of the bishop. That is why the priest sits in the large chair at Mass. It represents the presence of the bishop. Bishops also ordain deacons who are called to serve. Most of our permanent deacons are involved in service to the poor, the sick and the frail. Even new priests have been ordained as deacons, which they carry with them into their priestly life. The service of the needy, therefore, is at the root of priestly life.

Jesus was with us in our earthly life, and when we live together as the Church, we have a material, a visible reality. As a young priest I couldn't have known all the knowledge that I would need to have to take account of these practical things. As a pastor appointed by the bishop, I'm responsible for everything from the condition of the church toilets to the eternal salvation of everyone, even those who aren't in Church or even Catholic. Maybe that's why it is truly a vocation. You can't fulfill the job description without God doing all the heavy lifting!

In the early 2000's I was the Director of Lay Ministry at the chancery. I worked with people educated in theology and employed in pastoral roles, providing key ministry in parishes. It gave me a strong taste of the virtue of all of us working together building up the faith. Most living of the Gospel happens in our daily lives, when we go home, go to work or go to school. We can all deepen our commitment to Christ. It is Christ acting in us, therefore it is His call and our vocation.

Let's pray this weekend that these 5 young priests embrace the fullness of what the Lord wishes of them in the coming years and let's also pray that we learn more and more to help each other.

May Mary, the Mother of the Church and our Mother give glory to Her Only Son and through her intercession help us to offer our entire selves to God.

#### Congratulations & Prayerful Wishes to our Confirmandi


