Retreat Follow-Up

As promised during my homily last weekend, here is a link to some information about the books by Fr. Jacques Philippe, who conducted this year's annual priest's retreat: *'frjacquesphilippe. com/books'*. I plan to order a few copies for what I hope will be the start of our parish library and resource centre.

Fr. Jacques' approach owes something to the tradition started by St. Benedict of Nursia. The "Rule of St. Benedict" became the basis, not only for the communal life of the religious order we call the Benedictines and their various offshoots, but it influenced the rule of nearly every other religious community in the Church, whether it be male, female, contemplative or active. It's helpful to discover the varied approaches to prayer and the integration of living the Gospel, since we tend to live and breathe our faith on the shoulders of those who have gone ahead of us and benefit spiritually from them. The following are a few different spiritual charisms that arise from some of our saints.

St. Francis of Assisi had a great devotion to the Passion of Christ, with a view to embodying the reconciliation Christ won for the world. This is one reason we associate him with a love of nature and animals! He was literally making peace with the created order, with people and with the wondrous creation in which we live. As a result the Franciscan approach to prayer and life is marked by simplicity, poverty even, and concrete words and actions that both give God glory and help people to receive and reflect divine love. We might think of the followers of St. Dominic as being a simultaneous intellectual and conceptual counterbalance to those of St. Francis. Both approaches thrived in the Middle Ages and continue to enrich the Church today. The strong devotional practices, with which many of us are familiar, primarily originated during the 17th and 18th centuries. Much of what we now consider "traditional" either has its roots or became significantly popular in that era. The Society of Jesus also arose during this same period of time. From St. Ignatius of Loyola we received the Spiritual Exercises which continues to form the heart of Jesuit life; and to which retreat programs the world over have been influenced and guided by. People often turn to them, especially at times of change in their lives. We have Manresa Retreat Centre in Pickering, though its future is a little up in the air at the moment, so I should also mention the Jesuit Retreat Centre in Guelph.

In Toronto, we benefit from the particular gifts and charisms of several women's religious communities that have been responsible for so much of our faith within the city. The Sisters of St. Joseph, the Loretto Sisters, the Congregation of Notre Dame, and recently formed groups such as the Sisters of Life, have brought not only their missions but their spirituality and communal life. In my mind, what marks all these groups is an integration of the heart, the head and the hands in the service of God and of neighbour.

Some of you are using apps such as Hallow to explore these different gifts we have received from holy men and women. As we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity this weekend let us ask the Spirit to open us to all that God desires of us.
