A Message from the Pastor



Road Trips

Some of you may be making road trips this summer with your family. I have just about done mine (one short one to go). Here's a little sharing from journeys this spring.

My long trip away for almost 3 weeks in Italy was thankfully virtually all vacation no direct responsibilities. I was travelling with an art lover who is a retired eye doctor. Our time there overlapped for two weeks and then I had another five days on my own. Almost all our time was spent in Rome. We covered almost 30 churches and walked something like 17,000 steps most days. At St. Peter's we were able to take a tour of the excavations below the basilica where there are early graves of Christians including the grave of St. Peter. This was dug out in the 1950's and gives a glimpse of the earliest decades of the Church. The Basilica of St. Clement is also very old. It has a pagan temple below it. For me, one of the meaningful places to visit was the Church of Saints Marcellinus and Peter. Cardinal Aloysius Ambrozic, our Archbishop before Cardinal Collins was the honorary pastor of this church. It is just down the street from the pope's cathedral, the Basilica of St. John on the Lateran Hill that honours both St. John

the Baptist (whom we are celebrating this week) and St. John the Evangelist.

There were a number of important "St. Paul" sites. The most obvious is St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, the major basilica dedicated to St. Paul. I also visited the place which is simply referred to as the "Three Fountains", the site of St. Paul's martyrdom that is just a little distance from the centre of Rome.

Among other spiritual highlights were St. Monica's grave, St. Lawrence's grave, in the church of the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, the church associated with St. Philip Neri, the founder of the Oratory and the "Gesu", the principal church of the Society of Jesus. An artistic highlight for me was Bernini's "Ecstasy of St. Teresa" a beautiful marble sculpture in the Church of Our Lady of Victory not too far from the big train station in Rome. The outstanding historical thing for me was taking a full day walk through the Roman Forum and the area of the imperial palaces. Even here you run across Church history in the midst of the layers of Roman civic construction.

The week in Washington was for a medical ethics conference hosted by the International Association of Catholic Bioethicists and the Kennedy Institute of Ethics. The subject was healthcare and love. Perhaps only Catholics would be talking about these things side-byside. There are many senses to that word "love" and these were explored by doctors, specialists in Catholic mission, ethicists, philosophers, theologians and your pastor. It was also interesting to see the participation of younger people in their 30's and early 40's who are just getting their teeth into the big deal of why Catholics see health and the care for one another as a privileged expression of our identity. I've been going to these gatherings every couple of years for almost 25 years now. While it is great to see, there are many challenges. The truth, for example, that the Church so often tries to accomplish a great deal with a small number of people comes to mind.

I returned from both trips renewed and refreshed. While very different from parish life these things were nourishing. May your road trips whether near or far also nourish you this summer.
