
Envisioning the Coming Year

As we look forward to the coming year of prayer and activities together as a parish family, I would like to share some reflections that might help to shape the vision of our journey together. I'll start by drawing us back into the past. That is what has shaped the riches from which we can draw now. I was starting grade 12 when Pope John Paul II was elected. He was our shepherd for 27 years. In that time, he brought forth things we take for granted today: the Code of Canon Law, the Catechism, and a focus on evangelizing the Gospel. Contained in these things and the many other papal documents was a philosophy of human personhood, emphasizing not only our individual development as moral persons, but the integral dimensions of it, the implications for how we relate, socially and as the Church.

At the time of his death in 2005 many commentators said it would take the Church a long time to absorb the breadth and depth of his legacy. He gave us much to draw from. In 2005, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger was elected Pope, and took the name Benedict XVI. Pope Benedict's teaching focused us on the person of Jesus Christ and the love of God. While social media and the world we have now full of diverse opinions was emerging, he was calling us to remain centred on the person of Jesus Christ and the initiative of God's saving love. His legacy also comes from his time as Prefect of the then Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. He drew our attention to the risks of relativism where our wants are all treated equally and where the nature of revelation and even of reason which rightly value some things more than others are subordinated. We hear that thread in society when we only accept any statement as mere opinion, unable to enter substantive debate that might actually reveal what is important.

In 2013, the present Holy Father, Pope Francis was elected. His papacy has taken up themes of John Paul II. The Dicastery (department) for Integral Human Development is an extension of the personalist philosophy that was sewn through John Paul's writings. He has added to that the sometimes-uncomfortable challenge to implement the living of the Gospel for the benefit of those who suffer most from the excesses of this world. Of course, this has not been the most popular. He's asking us to take on things that are difficult and that run against the grain of the flow of society.

If we are looking at ourselves, then, we will need to commit to following the



perennial advice of St. Paul, "to bear with one another" charitably while we learn to discern, facilitate and work together always formed by Christ, experienced in the sacraments and the life of prayer. I hope this is a key year for us in becoming a really solidified parish family, rolling up our sleeves together in making Christ present. Please take a little time in the remainder of the summer to reflect on the breadth of the moral life to which you have been called and the part you might play in our little part of the Church.



Summer Street Patrol


