# \* A Message from the Pastor

#### **Ministers of the Good News and of Christ**

The common term to describe us when we devote time and energy for others is, "volunteer". It comes from the Latin word "volo", meaning "I will". In other words, we choose to do certain things. The contrast is when we have a job, someone else chooses the work. In our life together in the Church, however, once baptized we have more to say about what we do. We all have some life to which God personally calls us. As a part of God's family our words and actions are no longer solely our own. They reflect our living relationship with Christ and the new creation in Him. As a family, as well, we have a life together in the Body of Christ.

That's why when we work together either to do the essential things like the sacraments or to build up one another, we say we are acting not on behalf of ourselves but in the name of the Church.

This is both a privilege and a responsibility. It is St. Paul who tells us that it is Christ working in us and not we who do the work. Well then, let it be so. Help us to be good ministers of Your Gospel, O Lord!

I have served in a wide variety of parish

communities over the years. While I have found some ministries common to them all, each community has also had ministries that have arisen from their own gifts and needs. As Director of Lay Ministry, I concluded that it was the vitality of the Gospel that counted – not how many people or how many ministries a parish had.

So, our aim is clear. We want to enhance the vitality of every person's vocation in the parish family. In the coming year, I hope we will see our "core" ministries being strengthened and the natural development of new ministries that will give us a happy boost into deeper Christian life.

I will say also that for many, our vocations are with our families. At the end of each Sunday Mass, we are sent out to be sacraments of Christ in daily life. In a way, this makes participating at Mass, or as I sometimes say, "ministry of the pew", the first and maybe the most important ministry. The key for each of us, is: Is our light switch turned on? If we are fully engaged then we are on our way.

The Lord is truly gracious. May you start into the fall convinced of His care, support and inspiration.
