# \* A Message from the Pastor

#### **Spiritual Communion**

This weekend, at the end of Mass, we will be praying a novena leading up to the celebration of the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Toronto, St. Michael. These nine days of prayers not only keep us mindful of the fact we have a patron saint, but that grace is active beyond our senses. I would say, even when we pray our most private prayers alone, they contribute something to the good of the whole Body of Christ. It is the nature of the spiritual order.

This week I concelebrated at the funeral of my old pastor from St. Edward's Parish, Fr. Bernie Cryer. He was ordained in 1950! He had been retired for quite a while. Not many priests who were any part of his years of ministry were able to be present. His family was there and a few parishioners from his parishes.

To my mind, however, there was a much more numerous body of souls there: his brother priests, friends, family and parishioners who had preceded him. And really, the Church itself was present. It reminded me of something very important, which I know I would do well to remember in the back and forth of everyday life. We are part of a great spiritual communion.



At each of the weekend Masses you usually hear an intention for the Mass announced. One of the Masses is always for the living and deceased members of the parish. It represents my spiritual communion as pastor with the souls of those I serve. As well as that fairly wide net there usually are a couple of Mass intentions that people in the parish have requested. The priest celebrating the Mass is committed to making the requested intention his intention at the Mass. Having the intention announced is also an invitation for others to make the request part of their offering and prayers at the Mass as well. It is another way that our spiritual communion is expressed.

During the week we usually only have a couple of intentions requested. We could have an intention at each Mass and if the intentions increased sufficiently, we could choose a day to have a number of intentions together. Often, these requests are to pray for a particular person who has died. That's because we can unite ourselves to them spiritually and help them to be fully prepared to be in God's presence. It helps us also to think about those things we might need to let go of to be ready to see God face-to-face. Speaking very personally, it is a great consolation to me to pray for and I believe also with my parents and to continue my communion with so many who have been part of my life. We can also request an intention for someone who is living or even our own intentions, and they can be announced or not announced.

Perhaps, when you reach the end of the day and give thanks to the Lord for all His blessings you might also include that invisible communion. Help us, O Lord, to walk with the living graces You give us through others. Amen.
