❖ A Message from the Pastor

St. Michael the Archangel

We live in a time with its fair share of contradictions. On the one hand, we recognize that the orderly, logical and scientific approach to life is what physically allows us to live together in greater numbers than ever before. On the other hand, quietly we acknowledge that this is not very satisfying; and so, we look for the poetic. From music to fantasy to the invisible.

Angels are one of those categories of beings that sometimes catch our attention. St. Augustine affirms that "angel" is the job description while they are "spirits". Like us, who are body and spirit, they are created. In the Book of Revelation, we frequently read about the spirit who is the great messenger, the Archangel Michael. The name, "Michael", literally means, "Who is like God?". Michael testifies to the divinity and sovereignty of God. This is an essential truth for us to hear and to live by. Like Michael we give honour to God by our very living.

Because the idea of a spiritual being seems so flexible it can become a "creature" of our own imaginations - hence the more sensational descriptions we sometimes get. Aside from the spiritual being who denied the truth of Michael's testimonies and those spirits allied with evil enterprise, the spirits who do adore God give us a greater hope of the salvation which has been won for us, in Christ. They also serve to protect us.

On the other hand, too often we don't give enough space to our own spiritual nature. The term used in the not so remote past in the life of the Church was that we should be striving to be "recollected". Just as we might have ways we are expected to behave at work, it is easy to have a veneer of recollection, to appear to have "it together". It is a bigger challenge to strive to come to grips with ourselves, our busy lives and our distractions. The Holy Spirit is speaking to us. Our angels are not only interceding for us but singing to our hearts to help us turn toward God. The value of our lives also needs to be seen more in the spiritual order. Too often we miss the forest for the trees, both the positive aspect of underestimating the goodness of the graces we receive, and the negative aspect of failing to welcome into the depths of our hearts the intimacy of Christ.

As we celebrate St. Michael, patron of the Archdiocese of Toronto, may we enter into a place of sufficient peace that



God can move us closer and closer. Let's welcome the saints and the spirits who are our angels as they help us to be free of all that gets in the way of making our lives a vital witness to the unfathomable love of God.
