### **A Message from the Pastor**



#### More Than the Leaves are Turning Red

Last weekend we received the stunning news that our Archbishop, Francis Leo, will be elevated to the College of Cardinals, with 20 others, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8th. The announcement was a surprise, but for our Archbishop it is novel in several ways. He will be the 3rd youngest in the college. He was the only North American chosen. Perhaps, most unusual is that we will have not one but two Cardinals of voting age, Cardinal Collins and soon Cardinal Leo.

Maybe a little "FAQ" would be appropriate here. What are Cardinals? They are bishops who become, in essence, part of the life of the Diocese of Rome. Cardinals who work at the Vatican often begin in the lowest rank, "Cardinal-Deacons". Diocesan bishops who are elevated to the College are usually of the middle rank, "Cardinal-Priests". The most senior Cardinals in terms of responsibility and/or seniority may progress to the highest rank, "Cardinal-Bishop". most numerous are the Cardinal-Priests and they make up a significant majority of those who will, someday, vote for the next Pope. Each Cardinal-Priest is made an honorary pastor of one of Rome's parishes. Our Archbishop has yet to receive the title of the church for which he will be nominally responsible. Cardinal Collins is the nominal pastor of "San Patrizio", St. Patrick. The Paulist Fathers staff the parish. In principle, then it is the pastors of the parishes of Rome who elect the Bishop of Rome.

It is common that Cardinals who have dioceses are also appointed to sit on committees that oversee various Vatican Departments. It remains to be seen what additional responsibilities our new Archbishop may receive.

The College of Cardinals is supposed to have around 120 members of voting age. As of December 8th, it could be as high as 142. However, since Cardinals cease to be voting members of the College on their 80th birthday, it will likely drop to 127 or less by the end of 2025. Cardinals over the voting age can and are consulted in various ways, either in gatherings in Rome or by other means of communication.

Historically, Toronto had the honour of having a Cardinal at its head for the first time in 1946, when James Charles Cardinal McGuigan was elevated. It was the first time there was a Cardinal in Canada outside of Quebec. Our next Cardinal was Gerald Emmett Cardinal Carter who was elevated by St. John Paul II, in 1979. As a bishop he participated in all of the sessions of the Second Vatican Council. His successor, Aloysius Cardinal Ambrozic was elevated in 1998, and Cardinal Collins in 2012.

The Holy Father has been elevating bishops from a broader spectrum of the Church, even in places that have never had a Cardinal. He also has sometimes chosen bishops who are not in important dioceses. This might suggest to us that the Holy Father believes that our Archbishop has gifts that can really assist the Universal Church in the present and help it to prepare for the future. Please pray for him and for all of us who help him to be an effective shepherd and herald of the Good News here in Toronto.
