❖ A Message from the Pastor

A Sacrifice of Praise

Last weekend we observed Thanksgiving Day and this weekend the Church is celebrating World Mission Sunday. At the Eucharist, we participate with Christ in His self-gift to us and for us: "Take and eat, this is my Body". As the Church, together, we pour ourselves out in a gift of praise of God. This is a religious act. As part of this event, Christ makes Himself present in the Eucharist, His is very life that we might receive life.

So much of what we do outside of what we think of as religious is like this too. If we want a deep relationship, we pour ourselves out in some significant way, placing ourselves in the care of another person or even a group of people. And they, give something of themselves. The test is how whole is the gift and how healthy is it? Is it life-giving? Does it open us to be more able to share and give of ourselves? As I have mentioned several times in homilies, the formal interview of a couple preparing for marriage includes a question as to whether the relationship is loving, caring and equal, resulting in a true partnership. Things that result in relationships that are less than equal, loving or caring can have a hold on us because they fill some gap and help us cope, but they do not liberate us to wholly love and be loved.



Over and over in the Gospels we read of Jesus' healing, of raising people to life and freedom. This is certainly an important reason why the truth of the Gospel becomes recognized and accepted. We are seeing the Universal Church now being enriched by the gifts of love, hope and strong bonds in faith from earlier generations of missionaries. These Churches in Asia, Africa and Latin America are now sharing their vitality with the world. It is part of what makes even our local Church here in Toronto alive!

We are together in that missionary spirit. In a secular society whose policies are often more directed by quantitative sociological analysis than by the fruits of

actual and healthy relationships the vitality of our faith and how we support one another in living it can have a great effect. Is it possible to see a renewal, a very healthy, mature and generous renewal of the life of faith in Canada, in our own part of the world? Yes. It is. World Mission Sunday reminds us of how we are united by the one Holy Spirit. As much as our technological society has to offer, the spiritual freedom our faith offers allows us to give and receive life in more a whole and healthy way.

Housekeeping

New to our St. Paul's Community?

Welcome to St. Paul's Basilica! If you've recently, or not so recently, joined our parish community, please take a moment to fill out a parish registration form. There are many benefits to registering at the parish. It enables easier and more accurate donation tracking so you receive a tax receipt. It allows us to verify your information if you need a reference or are planning to celebrate or be part of a sacrament in the future. We can even transfer your records to another parish if you move. Forms are available at the back of the church or in the parish office.

Moving / Moved?

If your mailing address has changed we kindly ask that you notify the parish office by phone at 416-364-7588 or email at stpaulsbasilica@archtoronto.org, so we can ensure our records are up-to-date and there are no delays in issuing tax receipts.

Different Ways to Give

There are many different ways to donate to the parish.

- Envelopes: If you use the visitor's envelopes and wish to receive a tax receipt, please ensure that your name and address are clearly written. Registered parishioners can request envelopes with assigned donor numbers linked to their records.
- 2. *Direct Debit:* You can sign up to have your donation debited monthly directly from your bank account or credit card. You can choose where to direct your donation within the parish or request an additional amount be debited for months with special archdiocesan collections.
- 3. *Securities:* By donating stocks, bonds or mutual funds you can avoid capital gains allowing you to give more.
- 4. *Time & Talent:* Donations don't always have to be monetary. Consider volunteering your time or abilities with a parish ministry or event.


Queen of the Apostle Renewal Centre Retreats
