The Power of Attention

Last weekend was the Santa Claus parade. Society is getting to be in the Christmas mood. Certainly, the retailers, whether in stores or online are primed. Black Friday and Cyber Monday read like a litany, shouting: "More!". Traffic jams are getting "jammier". Our psyches are picking up on the nervous energy.

Yet, the most important thing we will share with each other this Christmas is ourselves. To love and to be loved requires attention. A child learning to stand or to walk looks fixedly at their parent while the parent beams and says encouraging words. This mutual attention turns into the momentary universe for both of them. What a graced opportunity to see and share the purity of love! How many times a week do we have the opportunity to give someone focused attention?

We also need to give ourselves attention. I don't want to be so inward-looking that I end up ruminating, just going over and over the same things. That can be hard to take. It is a real benefit, however, to pause long enough to understand what I am feeling. I may or may not know why, but acknowledging the emotion, can help me to be more present to others. I may realize that some of my perceptions come from my own distractions. I can also learn to come to terms with myself, so that I accept that patience and God's grace along the way will quietly change things in me. In turn, that helps me to receive from others in a richer way and I become freer to respond deeply.

Consider a little less time with headphones on or scrolling through social feeds. Even what seems like remote attention can be valuable. Do you notice the other people on the subway or the streetcar? Even though there is no explicit communication you can be grounded there in a way that lets others know that you are content to be there. Some people are so isolated that their ride on the streetcar or the subway might be their most "social" interaction



for the week. Is not presence to one another an important way that we seek to transform the culture? It is certainly a way to soften the ground for the possible reception of the Good News that Christ's love is at the door of every heart.

How important time and attention are! If this was your major commitment in Advent, giving your attention to God in prayer, both speaking and listening and doing the same with your neighbour and even with yourself, I have no doubt that celebrating the coming of the Saviour will be a transformative experience.

I pray that each of us may be present to Christ anew this Christmas and that we will prepare for it by taking the time and giving the attention to one another that the Lord Himself gives to each of us.

There are many different ways to donate to the parish.

- 1. *Envelopes:* If you use the visitor's envelopes and wish to receive a tax receipt, *please ensure that your name and address are clearly written.* Registered parishioners can request envelopes with assigned donor numbers linked to their records.
- 2. *Direct Debit:* You can sign up to have your donation debited monthly directly from your bank account or credit card. You can choose where to direct your donation within the parish or request an additional amount be debited for months with special archdiocesan collections.
- 3. *Securities:* By donating stocks, bonds or mutual funds you can avoid capital gains allowing you to give more.
- 4. *Time & Talent:* Donations don't always have to be monetary. Consider volunteering your time or abilities with a parish ministry or event.
