Goals in a New Calendar Year and with the Holy Family

The change in the calendar year is a time when collectively we go through a kind of catharsis. We "get rid" of some things and embrace new ones. People often look at goals. Some of them are practical. Famously or maybe notoriously, we think about working out or changing our diets. Spiritually, our big catharsis time is really Lent, the period before Easter, but this new calendar year can be a time when we re-envision our lives, letting go of something of our struggles in the past year and building lives aimed at being fruitful in the long run, in life and for the Kingdom.

I was in the grocery store recently and happened to hear a bit of a phone conversation where someone was proffering that if another person was not "upwardly mobile" it was their own fault. What a limited goal! The best result of that would be, "See, I am really good!" It seems to me that a goal that invites us to love better, to give more freely and happily and to rejoice in the gifts of life will be much more fruitful and lead to a kind of contentedness that money can't buy. Our goals reflect the perception we have of our identity and that's why we want to consider where our heart really is. We do live in a world with all sorts of materiality and we need to be practical but also remember the world itself is a gift. How we use it has a cumulative effect, and for us who have faith we need to reflect our real identity as children of the Father and adopted sisters and brothers of Jesus in what we do.

Today we celebrate the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph. They lived very practical lives for years together. Jesus grew into the use of the carpenter's bench before he came to announce the closeness of God the Father. Joseph put his heart through his hands in providing not only for his family but for those who benefited from his services. Mary revealed herself to Jesus by being available and responsive to God's will, at every stage of Jesus' earthly life, including life at home. The Gospels tell us often of Jesus' readiness to be in social situations, so we can speculate that the Holy Family shared an hospitable home, welcoming family and friends and doing their part in the community.

Perhaps it is on the horizon of heart and home that our best resolutions for 2025 might be chosen. May each of our homes and our families be true dwellings for Christ this year.
