A Message from the Pastor



Everyone Has a Story

As the city gets bigger, we appear to become more anonymous. Sometimes it's okay to be anonymous; but it's not a desirable full-time occurrence. As many of you who live near St. Paul's know we have quite a few neighbours who make their home on various bits of public land. As we advocate to address the homeless crisis around us, we can easily forget that each homeless person has their own story.

Within our own circle of family and friends there may be situations where we must navigate social delicacy, if not outright social discomfort. There is an elephant in the room, and we don't know how to talk about it. Sometimes we need to be patient and wait for the right moment to do something positive in the situation.

There are many identifiable factors that affect a significant number of people experiencing homelessness. The sheer cost of housing, mental health issues, the availability and the effects of drug use that mask emotional pain, and even technological advancements that require the use of a smartphone for transactions.

Over Christmas I became concerned about one person who has been living outside near the church. We began to have short conversations, and I brought a bit of food over for several days. I was also worried about the expected cold weather conditions. A few days ago, having spent a few hours with the person, and learning the person was no longer able to walk, it was agreed that a trip to the hospital was in order.

In our conversations the most piercing thing that was said to me was: "People give me assistance, but I don't get any help." As we talked the meaning became clear; handouts happen, but no one was consistently there to help navigate the steps that would change things. What was needed were skills and relationship. The person is 60, has been homeless for 10 years and has had experiences that stoke distrust. Talking to a social worker friend of mine about what might happen next, there is no guarantee that this person will fully receive the treatment they need or that someone will help them navigate to more stable housing. The system passes them from one area to another, and it is

not surprising that one can begin to feel more like an object than a person with a real life and a real story.

It seems to me that one thing a parish is, is a place where we are all allowed to have our story. It is from that starting point we can grow in love and discipleship. At one of my previous parishes, we had a person who worked one day a week helping people navigate the various available assistance services, while walking with them. The difference here is that we were striving to provide a sense of community in the midst of people's struggles. It took time to cultivate relationships with some of the local agencies (and get periodic advice from them) and to begin to see an effect on the overall picture. If any of you have had experience here at St. Paul's (or elsewhere) that you think might be useful to me in designing something here that will make a significant difference I would be very happy to hear from you.

New to our Parish Community?

Welcome to St. Paul's Basilica! If you've recently, or not so recently, joined our parish community, please take a moment to fill out a parish registration form. There are many benefits to registering at the parish. It enables easier and more accurate donation tracking so you receive a tax receipt. It allows us to verify your information if you need a reference or are planning to celebrate or be part of a sacrament in the future. We can even transfer your records to another parish if you move. Forms are available at the back of the church or in the parish office.

Moving / Moved?

If your mailing address has changed we kindly ask that you notify the parish office by phone at 416-364-7588 or email at stpaulsbasilica@archtoronto.org, so we can ensure our records are up-to-date and there are no delays in issuing tax receipts.

Different Ways to Give

There are many different ways to support the parish.

- 1. Envelopes: Registered parishioners can request envelopes with assigned donor numbers linked to their records. Visitors who wish to receive a tax receipt should make sure to clearly write names and address on the generic envelopes.
- 2. Direct Debit: Donations can be debited directly from your bank or credit card and directed to the parish or special archdiocesan collections.
- 3. *Tip Tap:* Simply tap your card on the device amount to donate. For a tax receipt, register your card.
- 4. Securities: By donating stocks, bonds or mutual funds you can avoid capital gains allowing you to give more.
- 5. Time & Talent: Donations don't always have to be monetary. Consider volunteering your time or abilities with a parish ministry or event.


