

A Message from the Pastor



Praying Together During The Jubilee

The objective of the Church is quite different from most other entities. It is not expansion for expansion's sake. While we love to see more people gathered to Christ, our proclaiming of Him is meant to co-operate with God's own action. Although it is far easier to measure success in numbers, we are looking for saints! We are in a quality business, not quantity. This runs against the grain of the highly marketed world we live in, where stimulation, marketing and transactions rule the day.

We need to be engaged in our faith, however, the ways in which we personally express our faith should also allow others to use their own spiritual and human gifts. Unlike many areas of our culture, we do not use our gifts to say, "Hey, look at me!", but rather to follow the example of John the Baptist in allowing Christ to be greater, and us to be smaller. Last weekend I mentioned that the Holy Father has published an app for the Jubilee year as a way of linking us together in prayer. The English name of the app is simple; Click To Pray and is available for both Apple and Android platforms. I've taken a little time to survey the app. It provides a structure to pray at the beginning, middle, and end of each day. The content comes from a variety of spiritual traditions within the Church, and includes Ignatian spirituality, prayers for mental health, the daily readings from Mass, and the prayer intentions of the Holy Father. You can also share your prayers with others on the app. One distinctive feature is that this app DOES NOT COLLECT DATA! How surprising in this day and age! It is simply a platform to pray together.

There are other apps that have more prayers available. I use *iBreviary* and *Divine Office*. I know many people use *Hallow* and *Universalis*. These are all praiseworthy. The *Click To Pray* app is simple and allows a very direct way for us to share in our identity as members of the whole Church. There is also no cost or required subscription to use *Click To Pray*.

Whichever way you choose to pray, please remember not only your own intentions and needs, but those that will serve the Gospel in every place. Not only do we learn that we are not alone when we pray in this way, but we actively share in deepening the life of the whole Church.
