A Message from the Pastor



Church and Society

A number of years ago a Toronto based Church historian, Dr. Mark McGowan, wrote a biography of our first bishop, Michael Power. The struggles faced by the Church at the inception of the Toronto diocese were not that different from the struggles the Church currently has relating to civil authority. The one big difference between now and then is that in 1842 there was no doubt of the important role religion had in civic life. Bishop Power managed to communicate that the Church intended to cultivate responsible citizenship. It was an uphill battle, not only for recognition, but for the freedom to grow.

Slowly, the Church was allowed to expand. An important aspect of our city's identity over the last few decades has been its willingness to provide a home for immigrants; especially after World War II, when many Italians, Portuguese and other Europeans arrived. The Italians who came were so large in number that the footprint of the Church increased greatly.

Now, in an age when societal values are, at times, more clearly in conflict with our understanding of the truths and implications of our faith, it is challenging to make clear the significant contribution that living our faith is making to society and what difference it could make.

Canada has grown from a population of about 18 million in 1961, when I was born, to 40 million today. Add to this the complicating landscape of social media, and the sheer diversity of voices, and it is not hard to understand that things can get lost in the shuffle. This complexity also applies to religion. These days we have higher numbers of people coming from a greater variety of countries, cultures and faiths. This at least suggests that people of faith need to work together to affirm the value their faiths bring to the larger society.

From our perspective, being rooted in our faith is of supreme value. It is the place from which we gain our identity. Flowing from it is mutual respect, love of neighbour, and freedom from misdirected ambitions. When we think of the common good, it is not only things that are positive that we can agree on or that have broad utilitarian value, but it speaks to the qualitative conditions that allow people to thrive and exercise mutual care. The fact that our participation in society is not only motivated by faith but shares the love that we know is a gift rather than a possession. This means it can be received by others and grow in them also by grace.

Let us not lose heart at the developments in society that trouble us but gain heart! We have to chip away steadily at any obstacles by cooperating with divine love and grace and bring hope to those who need it. Our citizenship is also a gift not meant for destructive behaviour but for the imitation of the love of Jesus in the here and now.


