

❖ A Message from the Pastor



You Have the Words of Everlasting Life

As we begin the season of Lent, we seek to live the gift of new life as deeply and clearly as possible. For those preparing to receive the Sacrament of Baptism at the Easter Vigil, Lent is a period of purification, which will culminate in a total belonging to Christ. Gospel takes us into the desert, where Jesus thwarts three temptations which represent the wilier parts of the human heart influenced by evil.

The first temptation is to lessen the importance of our relationship with God in favour of our own wants and needs. The second of the temptations is for power and status. The third is that we are somehow preserved by God from our own recklessness. What these all have in common is that we are somehow telling God what behaviour we expect - making ourselves into God.

While we might recognize our own tendencies to egoism in the daily back and forth of our lives, we may not be seeing the ways in which quiet desperation, greed, and insecurity play in the background. My dad had an old expression that was common among Catholics of his era: "We have not here a lasting city." Another way of saying much the same thing is the expression that we are "in the world, but not of it". Today's Gospel is powerful because it captures some of the essential ways that sin and death are embodied in our earthly lives. It ushers in the New Covenant in Christ which purifies creation.

Repeatedly, Christ announces to the devil His reliance on the Father and His trust in the Father's goodness. Our position as Christians is a challenging one. We cannot be satisfied with the present situation, nor are we to be discouraged from living out the gift of new life we have received. The temptations of our age are perhaps to see our vocations as individual or private, keeping our Christian lives "safe", or to be blind to the corrosive effects of the evils of greed, power, status and entitlement.

This Lent God is speaking the Word to us. Ask for guidance about how you are being called to make your contribution to the building up of God's Kingdom. No, we are not only concerned with this earthly city, nor are we sealing ourselves off from the great potential body of believers whom Jesus desires to be His own. We are seeking to live with vitality the life we received at Baptism. Let us have a blessed Lent together.




