

A Message from the Pastor



The Final Days of Lent

Holy Week, especially the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, bring our journey with Jesus to a solemn culmination of the Lenten Season. Our Lenten practices have been aimed at freeing ourselves to be present with Jesus in the here and now. In our prayer, we have asked the Lord to heal us so that we might reflect His love. We have prayed for others, many of whom we know and many whom we do not know but whose sufferings we are aware of. During each of the Sundays in Lent, as we celebrate Christ's resurrection, we give thanks for all that is good.

In denying ourselves some of life's ordinary pleasures, we were reminded not to take what we receive for granted, and freedom from believing that physical things will make our lives meaningful or give us peace in of themselves. Hopefully,

we have found encouragement, within this little bit of discipline, to share what we have received more easily. Like St. Francis, maybe we have found a greater freedom in simplicity as well — in our hearts, in the comings and goings of our lives, in the way we receive others' words and welcome.

Perhaps taking some initiative to share with the needy has, hopefully, borne fruit. We have been concretely reminded of the infinite worth of each person, regardless of whether walking together is easy or difficult. We have found value in giving, noting that it frees us somehow.

All these things help us not only to learn to rely on God more, but they break down something of what separates us from one another. It is in this spirit that we arrive at these solemn days. Our silence has lots of content and meaning. From the celebration of the First Eucharist at the Last Supper, through the procession to the Garden, and the grand silence that follows, we experience the movement of the Holy Spirit, drawing us closer to Christ's heart. On Good Friday, as we commemorate the Crucifixion and death of Jesus, we contemplate the change that comes to the whole creation in Christ's silence in the tomb.

It is quite right to say this is the culmination of Lent. Finally, on Holy Saturday night comes a force greater than nature itself, as Jesus emerges from the darkness and leads us into His light. May you all have a blessed Holy Week!




