❖ A Message from the Pastor

A Little About the Church

When Pope Benedict XVI resigned the papacy, in 2013, the transition to a new pope felt somewhat different compared to now. As surprising as the resignation was, psychologically we were looking ahead to the changeover to a new pope. Conversely, when Pope John Paul II died in 2005, after having served since the autumn of 1978, his absence was strongly felt. At present we are experiencing a similar sense of absence. The Diocese of Rome is vacant (Sede Vacante).

Collectively, the College of Cardinals is responsible for the Universal Church. Technically, the heads of the various departments are currently without a job, until assignments are made by the new pope. In the Eucharistic Prayer we make no mention of the pope until he is elected. We unite ourselves to our local bishop only.

This highlights a few things about the nature of our life together in the Catholic Church. The Universal Church is made up of local churches, each one led by a successor of the apostles. In addition, we also have the existence of Catholic churches of different rites, for example, the Ukrainian Catholic Church. Maronite, Melkite, Chaldean, Byzantine Slovak, Syro-Malabar and Syro-Malankar churches also have bishops in Canada.

The ministry of the successor of St. Peter is centred on the unity of the Church. Ordinarily, when we pray for the pope during the Eucharistic Prayer, we not only



express our deep prayer for him personally, but we acclaim our communion with him. While there are many aspects of the Church that appear to us to be "top down", this is a time when we might reflect a little more on the bottom-up aspect. Our bishop relies on the cooperation of his priests and the priests are sent to serve communities of believers. In the six parishes I have served, plus the one I grew up in, I have always found different characteristics in each community. If you have moved around parishes in your life, you may have seen this as well.

In each community, the faith is being lived in its own distinct way. There are signs of differing needs to support the life of the Gospel. There are challenges to strike the right notes to help one another incorporate the life of faith. Whether from the lips of Pope John Paul or Pope Benedict or Pope Francis, the mission to help others to encounter Christ also puts us in the forgiving, repairing and healing business. What our parish is like and what it does, then, is a critical part of the life of the Church more widely.

As we pray that the Holy Spirit provide for us a new Holy Father who is ready to shepherd our lives in Christ fruitfully, let us also pray that our capacity to care for our brothers and sisters around the world may help us to be in communion with the work of the Universal Church.


