* A Message from the Pastor

Complementary Vocations on Good Shepherd Sunday

Although I am writing this the day before the start of the Conclave in Rome, I expect that by the time you read this we will have welcomed a new Holy Father. How providential that we have a new shepherd on Good Shepherd Sunday, the traditional name for the 4th Sunday of Easter due to this weekend's Gospel reading. Christ is, of course, the Good Shepherd, and the pope, as the successor of St. Peter, shepherds the Church in His name.

Additionally, this Sunday, the second in the month of Mary, we celebrate Mother's Day, when we honour, appreciate, and rejoice in our mothers. Truthfully, we would not have neither healthy families nor a healthy society without their vocation. And motherhood is a vocation. As believers we understand that, but I think anyone as dedicated as a mother can see how it pulls one out of oneself. You've got to want to give, knowing that sometimes it is not easy. I am not sure there has ever been a time where maturing is easy, but at present, with all the changes in the world, it is quite challenging. No parent has been good at every part of the "parenting book". As I get older, I appreciate the challenges that faced my own parents. Not only do I find myself being compassionate toward them, but I see how heroic they were, despite it not being very visible to me when I was young.

This weekend also marks the ordination of three new priests for our Archdiocese, who, listening to the heart of the Good Shepherd, are being called to serve Him, by

being faithful to His self-gift in the Eucharist and in their lives. Congratulations to Rev. James Cyfko, Rev. Jesus Fidel Anon, and Rev. Alvin Joys. Each of these men is being called to serve in the busy parishes within our Archdiocese. May the Lord help them to joyfully enter into their vocation.

Good Shepherd Sunday is a time when we reflect on the importance of vocations to the priesthood, as well as to religious life and the diaconate. There is a great need in current society to live the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience, the heart of religious life. Each is both a sacrifice and a privilege. Poverty, a deep simplicity of life, and freedom from encroaching materialism, takes real grace to embrace. When we look at the way we can, at times, become overwhelmed by the sheer amount of information, advertising, and "influencing" that we encounter each day, is it surprising that some of us get confused? How helpful would it be to find souls who, in healthy ways, are able to detach themselves from these issues and in turn can help other become oriented towards God and order their lives? In a world which overlooks the emotional character of relationships, while being lost in a sea of emotions, what is it like to have to confront oneself and, with God's help, come to be at peace? This is one of the fruits of chastity. And finally, in a world of egos, where the highest value is placed on getting what we want or having others agree with us, what is it like to deepen our trust in God and put ourselves truly at



the service of others? "Here I am Lord; send me!"

The diakonia is the service that flows from the words of Our Lord Himself. "I have come for the sick". "I come as one Who serves." "There are many who are last, who will be first." We have many active permanent deacons in our Archdiocese whose ministry quietly serves those most in need, both within the family of the Church and beyond it.

May Christ, the Good Shepherd who calls us by name, bless each of our vocations, and help us to say 'yes' each day to Him.
