❖ A Message from the Pastor

Reflections on Bringing the Good News to the World

Today, we celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord to the Father, and observe the days ahead of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended. The Acts of the Apostles describe a scene where the Good News is being proclaimed and heard in the many languages of those gathered. Just recently, we witnessed the election of Pope Leo by the most international group of Cardinals in the Catholic Church to date. We are part of a truly global community of believers, with many voices proclaiming one faith.

More than 25 years ago, Pope John Paul II began a series of teachings preparing us for the celebration of the coming of the Third Millennium of Christianity. He sought to strongly ignite in us the vitality of the Gospel and reinvigorate us to bring Christ to the world. He also understood that to embody this new Advent in the life of the Church much work needed to be done.

If anything, 25 years on from that momentous anniversary, we see the need for new charisms, gifts of the Holy Spirit, to effectively send us out to share the Good News. Thus far, in his very short tenure, Pope Leo has already reminded us to move outward, echoing the words of Pope John Paul II to "go out into the deep", a common encouragement for young people during World Youth Day events.

As I shared from our annual priests' retreat last week, the vitality of the Holy Spirit comes in the midst of everyday life. Because



Christ comes to us, both fully revealed but also somehow hidden, it is in unexpected ways that He makes Himself known. Our first conviction must be that we are in a real relationship with God, and that God loves us, and thirsts for us. And we can trust that God is working in the midst of our imperfect efforts. The Holy Spirit comes to us as the Advocate, breathing the life of Christ into us, and through us; and also as the Encourager, the One who fills us with Hope, healthy aspiration, and the peace that

helps us to be more fully alive.

I pray, also, that we, as a parish community, will continue to discover new ways to work together, and embody the life of the Risen Lord


