Gifts of the Holy Spirit All the Time

As we travel along the arc of our lives, new things keep appearing on the horizon. Lately, I've been seeing quite a few young children, accompanied by their parents, at Sunday Mass. Their curiosity and sense of adventure is something beautiful to watch. Crawling around the pews or wandering up and down the aisles; there is so much to see! For the older children, our Altar Server ministry and Edge program help give them opportunities to begin envisioning what life and its many possibilities might look like. Young adults then take life's many possibilities and translate them into prospective futures. This becomes sharply pronounced in the couples I see during their preparations for marriage.

Then there are those who of us who have "landed". We work steadily, juggling our responsibilities, while also making sure life retains some of its nourishing texture. Now, speaking of myself, we priests retire at age 75. I'm 64, so retirement is still some time away, but it is a comprehensible number of years. I'm beginning to consider what sort of life I might find fruitful after retirement, aware that I may have some health issues by that time.

There, most certainly, is a "wisdom" phase in our lives. Perhaps, at times, this phase may be undervalued, because the circumstances of life change so quickly. Whether sharing wisdom, or listening to it, we would probably value it much more if we were to make an effort at "translation",

ensuring we are being heard, or that we are extracting the gold from it. Some wisdom is found non-verbally in faithfulness and a graceful attitude. One of the wise things we learn as we live our lives, circles around limitation and suffering. We don't have all the answers. Sometimes, we must simply put one foot in front of the other and be patient. To love and care has wonderful consolations, but also comes with frustrations, questions, and pain, when struggles are required to meet the day.

Lastly, we have the fragility of our lives to consider. This brings us back to something we may have been aware of at the very early stages of our lives: what a gift life is! We didn't decide to show up! We arrived! As we age and become frailer, is it possible to give a profound witness of the beauty of this gift? Yes, I think so. I have seen it again and again, in ordinary people who have met life with extraordinary grace. I found in these people strength and beauty that is far deeper than what we are in touch with when life is relatively easy.

The Holy Spirit is not only at work in our lives, no matter where in life we are at, but the Spirit is helping us to share what is eternal. St. Paul is not dismissing the body when he contrasts the life of the flesh and the life in the Spirit. He is affirming our reorientation in being part of the new creation. Even when our bodies are not co-operative there is much more at work in this gift of life. I realize that I have learned a great deal about living from those graced people, in the frailest phases of their lives, I have had the privilege to know.

Knowing that the Spirit will help us all along the way, gives us the grounding to live in faith, and consequently be more humanly alive as well. Thank you to all of you embracing the gifts of the Spirit in your lives right now!


