A Message from the Pastor


Approaching Our Parish Feast

Our parish is privileged to have two patron feast days per year. We celebrate the Conversion of St. Paul on January 25th, and we mark the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29th. This year's celebration for Sts. Peter and Paul falls on a Sunday, next weekend, in fact. Appropriately, next Sunday we will also celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation, with our regional bishop, Bp. Robert Kasun, CSB.

While we view St. Peter as the Bishop of Rome, and the person who became the foundation of the Church, we also recognize that St. Paul had a vast role in populating the Church. His travels across the Mediterranean established Christian communities sprinkled throughout the Roman Empire.

Paul's letters reveal to us the graces and the struggles of early believers. Paul, inspired by the Holy Spirit, provides an approach to developing maturity in each of the communities that he speaks to. At the heart is graciousness, along with sensible discernment. He offers encouragement far more than he admonishes, though he certainly "sets the record straight" on occasion. Discerning, for the good of the community, and of the Gospel, is a business that we all have some responsibility for. This path toward the growth of the Gospel and of the Church hasn't changed much over the centuries. These things are still much needed.

While the upcoming feast focuses on the fact that both Saints became martyrs in Rome, we should view this as they did, a crowning of the way in which they lived their lives. They too, shared the fate of Jesus. St. Paul is the one who reminds us that grace is added to grace. We are likewise living toward a crowning of our lives. For us, it is a springboard to the fullness of life. Like a small child who seeks to be in the arms of a parent, we are similarly reaching out to Christ our brother, Mary our mother and to God the Father.



We are very blessed to have St. Paul as our parish's patron; a constant reminder of the natural invitation to generosity. As we approach our great feast let us carry forward St. Paul's ministry of encouragement and his generous proclamation of Christ.

St. Paul's Summer Day Camp


Weekdays from July 7 - August 1; 9 am - 3 pm (extended care available)


