## Saint Paul

Today, June 29th, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. The feast includes both saints, not only because they were both apostles, but also because they were both martyred in Rome. Peter is the rock and Paul the evangelizer.

It's unusual that this feast falls on a Sunday, but since St. Paul is our patron, it is special for us. St. Paul travelled a good portion of the Roman Empire, around the Mediterranean Sea. We probably owe our faith today to his efforts.

This week, on July 1st, we also celebrate Canada Day, and our country being 158 years old. I would like to indulge in a little mind game. What if St. Paul was evangelizing Canada today? In many ways, he would meet the same challenges he experienced in his Mediterranean travels. The politics of his time encouraged, and even induced, a lot of relocation amongst the populous. 
Mass times, even with a purchased ticket from the machines. Violations carry a \$120 fine.
