❖ A Message from the Pastor

Keeping the Basilica Beautiful

I realize it's been quite some time since I last shared an update on the physical aspects of our parish, so I thought I'd share a little about what we've been up to and what's coming next.

This past year we took on some much-needed work in the house and office. Last fall we replaced the old boiler and hot water heater in the house with a high-efficiency system that now provides both domestic hot water and heat. Then, in the spring, when we had the air conditioning units inspected, we discovered dangerous mould and an outdated coolant that is no longer considered environmentally safe. This gave us the opportunity not only to replace the existing slim units but also to add new ones where needed.

As a result, three of the four suites in the house now have their own units, each with independent temperature control for cooling—and supplemental heating when required. This has proven especially helpful given the international composition of our clergy and seminarians, where comfort needs and preferences can vary among housemates. We also took the opportunity to add a unit in the sacristy, which has long been sweltering in summer since its windows are sealed shut.

Looking ahead, there are a few projects on the horizon that I'd like to highlight: lighting repairs and bulb replacement, painting sections of the fence, addressing the flashing around the church chimney as well as capping the chimney at the house, and possible roofing repairs to both the house and church.


The LED bulbs in the church pendant light fixtures are reaching the end of their service life. A few bulbs have already failed—some even literally breaking apart from heat damage. Fortunately, advances in bulb technology will allow us to replace them with more reliable options and select a colour of light that better complements the artwork in the church. In addition, the stage lighting that illuminates the sanctuary needs servicing. Several bulbs are out, and some of the transformers that regulate the power supply will require replacement.

Because much of this work is at significant heights, custom scaffolding will be necessary, which will unfortunately add to the cost. However, while the scaffolding is in place, we also plan to investigate replacing the six outdated and inaccessible smoke detectors mounted high on the ceiling arches along the side aisles.

Finally, work on the chimneys will likely require the use of a cherry picker to safely reach the affected areas, as well as get a better view of the condition of the roof tiles.

Beyond these immediate projects, there is also some potentially significant exterior work that will need attention. Repairs are needed on the stairs leading up to the office, sections of the walkway that have begun to heave, and the front steps where cracks and spalling have developed. We will also need to address foundation and basement waterproofing to protect the integrity of the building.

Looking further ahead, one of the most substantial projects will be the eventual replacement of the church's heating system. I have



asked the Archdiocese to partner with us on a building condition report that will help guide decisions on this and other long-term needs. At present, our heating is supplied by a low-pressure steam system powered by six ganged mid-efficiency boilers. While steam has the benefit of requiring no pumps, it is water-intensive, causes radiators to swing from room temperature to boiling, a potential safety concern, and offers limited flexibility.

Transitioning to a hot water system could open the possibility of cooling the building on summer nights and, importantly, allow for future integration of geothermal sources to reduce reliance on gas and electricity. However, this would be a major investment: replacing the existing steam boilers with a modern commercial unit will cost in the hundreds of thousands of dollars, while converting to a hot water system would be considerably more. We will certainly need expert consultation before charting the best course forward.

St. Paul's is an important part of the story of the Archdiocese and of the City of Toronto. For that reason, caring for this church and its buildings is more than just maintenance—it is stewardship of a sacred place that belongs to all of us. Thank you for your ongoing support as we care for the physical needs of our parish.
