# **❖ A Message from the Pastor**

# Redemption

During the past week, we celebrated the memorial of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, better known as "Padre Pio". Like the Curé of Ars, he was recognized for his deep insight in the confessional and his reverence in celebrating the Mass. The prayer for his feast reminds us that sharing in the Cross is not a burden but a privilege—a way of joining Christ in His redeeming love. The apostles themselves would have been happy to be amongst those redeemed, yet at first did not grasp that they were also called to join Christ's work of redemption. We are much the same. We celebrate the Resurrection and rejoice in Christmas but often struggle with the Cross. Like the apostles, we need time and grace to understand what redeeming love really asks of us.

On Monday, September 29th, the Church observes the Feast of the Archangels, and for us in a special way, St. Michael. We may know him from the prayer introduced by Pope Leo XIII, often recited in our Archdiocese, or from the Book of Revelation, where he, as one of God's messenger angels, proclaims God's victory over every breach of divine love and over death itself.

On Tuesday, September 30th, Canada marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation with our Indigenous Peoples. This, too, is part of the Cross, as uncomfortable as it may be. Whether we were aware of it or not, we have inherited a



history shaped by systems, implemented by the federal government, intended to erase Indigenous identity and make them "like us." In that lies the harm. Just as the wounds of the past touch us through our ancestors' choices, wittingly or unwittingly, so too the wounds borne by Indigenous Peoples call for healing. Reconciliation requires entering a new journey together, rooted in mutual respect and affection.

Our personal conversion follows the same pattern. We gradually recognize the barriers that keep us from a deeper life with God. Some are sins we know well; others arise from ignorance or neglect. Learned truthfulness to ourselves, patience, and openness to grace help cultivate life-giving responses. When we pray for our deceased loved ones, we intercede, by freely choosing to carry a part of their cross, that regardless of their shortcomings they be welcomed into heaven. Padre Pio, like St. Francis of Assisi, bore the stigmata on his hands as a privilege—literally bleeding as a visible sign

of his union with Christ's redeeming work. For most of us, the wounds remain hidden, but inwardly we share in the same work of redemption.

We believe not only that the Cross leads to the Resurrection, but that both are inseparably part of our life in Christ. May Christ the Healer, work on us and all those who have experienced harm. Help us together, to learn from one another and walk with those seeking to have their wounds healed. In this patient journey, may our indigenous brothers and sisters be granted wisdom and the gifts they need to recover those things that will help them to be themselves in peace and confidence. May that divine love that the Father has for us all, accomplish in Christ and through the Holy Spirit, the entirety of redemption.




#### World Mission Sunday


