A Message from the Pastor


St. Francis and Bishop Michael Power

This weekend, the universal Church celebrates the memorial of St. Francis of Assisi on Saturday, and on Sunday we remember the funeral of Bishop Michael Power, the first bishop of Toronto, which took place at the original St. Paul's Church in 1847.

St. Francis' radical embrace of simplistic life bore tremendous fruits during his lifetime. Thousands were drawn to join the Franciscan community, and St. Clare, his spiritual companion, founded the Poor Clares, a community of women who shared the same vision. All over the world this past Friday evening, Franciscans marked the "Transitus" of St. Francis, the commemoration of his passing into eternal life. In my previous parish, I had the privilege of having a local fraternity of the "Third Order" of St. Francis—lay men and women who commit themselves to living out Franciscan spirituality. That simplicity, among other things, shaped St. Francis' way of life into an experience of faith that engaged both body and soul.

In the Office of Readings for St. Francis, we hear these words from one of his letters:

"We must not be wise and prudent according to the flesh. Rather we must be simple, humble and pure. We should never desire to be over others. Instead, we ought to be servants who are submissive to every human being for God's sake. The Spirit of the



Lord will rest on all who live in this way and persevere in it to the end. He will permanently dwell in them. They will be the Father's children who do his work. They are the spouses, brothers and mothers of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Bishop Michael Power arrived in Toronto in 1842 and died just five years later, on October 1, 1847, a few days shy of his 43rd birthday. He contracted typhoid fever while ministering to the sick in the "Fever Sheds" near the lake, where many newly arrived immigrants were quarantined. His first Mass as bishop was celebrated at St. Paul's, which served as his temporary cathedral while St. Michael's was still under construction. Toronto at that time was a small, rough, and struggling community, yet Bishop Power poured himself into shepherding it with compassion and courage.

The lives of both St. Francis and Bishop Power were profoundly shaped by the circumstances around them. Francis, confronted with the futile conflicts of life in the Italian city-states, chose instead a life of peace, reconciliation, and joyful embrace of the Cross with serenity of heart. Bishop Power, facing hardship and disease in a young, fragile city, gave his life in service, bringing hope and healing to the sick and to those struggling simply to meet the basic needs of life.

Their witness invites us to recognize the path to holiness the Lord has set before us—not in a perfect world, but in bringing Christ into the real world we inhabit, with all its challenges and imperfections.




