❖ A Message from the Pastor



Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship

This is World Mission Sunday, when we unite ourselves with members of the Church throughout the world who are dedicated to the proclamation and nourishment of the Gospel. In the 21st century, the Church has widened its vision. Rather than focusing solely on places where the Gospel was previously unknown, Pope St. John Paul II invited us to embrace a renewed understanding of the Church's mission.

The Good News is transformative; yet in many parts of the world, the intentional living of the Christian faith has diminished in both intensity and appeal. The Holy Father, however, was not merely reacting to this decline. He recognized how easily faith can become confined within comfortable structures. This was, after all, one of the major criticisms Jesus directed at the religious leaders of His time.

As one of the fruits of the Holy Father's initiatives during the Great Jubilee (2000), the Third Millennium of Christianity, the Church was invited to enter into a renewed period of New Evangelization.

In Catholic theology, we make a distinction between evangelizing—helping people to receive the Good News—and catechizing—helping them to understand it. Together, these make up what we call

formation: living, implementing, and integrating the new life we have received in Christ. This process allows the inner transformation of faith to shape every part of our lives.

Our hope is that we all become disciples of the Lord Jesus, participants in the Church's mission, moved by grace to live and embody the Kingdom that the Lord tells us is "near at hand."

It is therefore not enough for us, as Catholics, merely to proclaim the Good News, nor to reduce our mission to the uttering of all moral and ethical implications of our faith. Our true mission compels us to help one another toward a deeper reception of faith in the person of Jesus Christ.

We are all vulnerable. To whom do we choose to reveal ourselves? Such openness requires deep trust. In the Gospels, it is always striking to witness the depth of encounter between Christ and those He heals. What unfolds in the space between His words—and in the silences that surround them? St. John Henry Newman, soon to be named a Doctor of the Church, captured this essence in his famous phrase, cor ad cor loquitur—"heart speaks to heart." The Lord's heart speaks to us, and our hearts respond to Him.

The journey of conversion is not a single moment on a line but the ongoing flow of grace within living relationships. Evangelization, therefore, is always in dialogue with learning and takes place within an atmosphere of formation—an environment that nurtures each person's "Yes" to God.

This is why something profoundly important takes place in parish life. Your presence here to offer God praise at Mass is a vital part of it. Yet this praise does not end when you leave the church; it continues and blossoms in daily life, in the midst of all the people you encounter.

The "newness" of the New Evangelization lies simply in recognizing that the Holy Spirit is alive and breathing within us, leading us to live our faith more fruitfully.

Let us give thanks for those who dedicate their lives to the proclamation of the Gospel and to the formation that sustains it. May the Lord help us to become mature missionary disciples, enabling others to live the Good News more deeply. And let us rejoice in the new life we have received.


